

Recorded headline crime increases by 1.4% in 2006

Overall, the number of recorded headline crime incidents rose by 1.4% (from 102,258 in 2005 to 103,710) in 2006. However, there were marked differences in the trend throughout the year, with a sharp increase of 10.1% in the first quarter (compared to the corresponding period in 2005) being partly offset by annual decreases of 1.5% and 3.2% in the third and fourth quarters respectively. *See tables 1a and 1b.*

When analysed according to headline offence group (see table 2), the following are the main changes between 2005 and 2006.

Group 01 - Homicides

The number of offences classified as either *Murder* or *Manslaughter* rose from 62 to 66 in 2006, an increase of 6.5%. The level of such recorded offences was 18 in the fourth quarter of 2006, the same as in the corresponding period of 2005.

Group 02 - Assaults

The most prevalent offence in this group, *Assault causing harm*, increased by 177 (20.7%) in the fourth quarter and by 255 (6.9%) in the year 2006.

Group 03 - Sexual Offences

Offences in this group were up by 4.2% in the fourth quarter but fell by 3.1% in the year. Recorded incidents of *Rape of a female* fell by 21 and 29 (24.4% and 7.9%) in the quarter and year, respectively.

Group 04 - Arson

Recorded incidents of *Arson* increased by 39 and 236 (9.5% and 16.7%) in the fourth quarter and year, respectively.

¹ Figures for the years 2003-2006 have been amended since the Quarter 3, 2006 release, which was published on 27th October last. This is a result of a technical issue which was brought to the attention of CSO by An Garda Síochána. The amendments do not affect the trends in the data in a significant way.

Group 05 - Drugs

The most prevalent in this category, *Possession of drugs for sale or supply*, rose by 204 (32.3%) in the fourth quarter of 2006. The increase for the full year 2006 was 349 (13.1%).

Group 06 - Thefts

Offences in this group accounted for 56% of all headline crime incidents in 2006. The total number of recorded theft offences was 58,111 in 2006, which is an increase of 1,468 (2.6%) on the 2005 total. *Theft from shop* increased by 1,962 (11.9%) while there were reductions or smaller increases in other offences within this group in 2006.

Group 07 - Burglaries

This group accounted for 23.9% of the total of 103,776 headline crime incidents in 2006. A reduction of 1,058 (14.5%) in the fourth quarter contributed to an annual reduction of 1,633 (6.2%) in the year.

Group 08 - Robberies

Robbery from the person offences rose by 54 (19.5%) and 110 (9.7%) in the quarter and year respectively. In 2006, Robbery of an establishment/institution and Robbery of cash/goods in transit fell by 49 and 13 (4.3% and 29.5%), respectively.

Group 09 - Frauds

Deception and false pretences incidents rose by 101 and 560 (17.5% and 27.3%) in the fourth quarter and in the full year, respectively.


Group 10 - Other Headline Offences

Although there was a reduction of 13 (3.0%) in *Possession of firearms* offences in 2006, there were 29 (34.1%) more of such offences recorded in the fourth quarter than in the corresponding quarter of 2005. Offences of *Abandoning a child, child neglect and cruelty* rose by 24 and 28 (46.2% and 10.4%) in the fourth quarter and full year, respectively.

Annualised total recorded crime falls in quarter 4, 2006

The annualised totals (i.e. the 12-month running total to the end of a quarter) fell consistently from the fourth quarter of 2003 to the first quarter of 2005. In the 12-month period ending in the fourth quarter of 2003, the total number of offences recorded was 103,470, compared with 97,376 in the first quarter of 2005. This was a decrease of 5.9%. Subsequently, there was a steady increase in the number of annualised recorded headline crimes, reaching a peak of 104,950 in the second quarter of 2006, an increase of 7.8% over the 15-month period. Provisional figures for the second half of 2006 indicate small decreases in the annualised totals for both the third and fourth quarters. As a result, the annual figure for the calendar year 2006 (at 103,710) was 1.2% below the peak recorded in the second quarter.

Background Notes

Introduction

The Headline Crime Statistics release provides provisional figures for the number of headline incidents recorded by An Garda Síochána. A retrospective quarterly series is given to the year 2003. Because of timing issues with respect to the extraction of data (which normally occurs a week after the end of a quarter) figures for the previous quarter are prone to subsequent revision. Also, because of other issues (particularly classification and counting procedures covered below) all data can be revised. This release gives the up-to-date situation for all periods covered.

Crime recording

Incidents reported or which become known to members of An Garda Siochána are recorded when, on the balance of probability, a Garda determines that a criminal offence defined by law has taken place and there is no credible evidence to the contrary. If it is subsequently determined that a criminal offence did not take place the criminal offence recorded is invalidated and is not counted in the statistics. If a person makes a report and subsequently withdraws it by stating that the criminal act did not take place then this too is invalidated unless there is evidence to suggest that by reasonable probability the offence has taken place. For criminal offences where victim confirmation is required (e.g. assault, fraud), a criminal offence is recorded only where the victim confirms the offence or where there is evidence to suggest that by reasonable probability it occurred.

Crime classification

A criminal offence is classified as a particular offence type at the initial recording of that offence. However, upon investigation, it may later become apparent that an alternative offence type should be used. In this event, the record is amended to reflect this. Re-classification on the basis of court proceedings only occurs in relation to homicide offences. A murder offence is reclassified as man-slaughter when a charge of manslaughter commences or when a murder charge results in a conviction for manslaughter. It is also possible, though more rare, that an incident originally classified as manslaughter may be re-classified as murder. Also, a re-classification to a homicide offence occurs when, for example, a serious assault has been recorded and, some time later, the victim dies as a consequence of the assault.

Headline offences

The quarterly figures consist of Headline Offences only, which is part of the classification used by the Gardaí since the year 2000. Included in the headline category are 99 offence types in all, which, in the Garda Annual Report come under the following headings: Homicides, Assaults, Sexual Offences, Arson, Drugs, Thefts, Burglaries, Robberies, Frauds and Other Headline Offences.

General counting rules

Crime counting rules are applied to all criminal offences for the purposes of the statistics. The following are the main rules relevant to the quarterly headline figures:

Primary Offence Rule: Where two or more criminal offences are disclosed in a single episode, it is the primary criminal offence that is counted. The primary offence is that offence which the greater penalty may apply. Where offences have similar penalties, offences against the person take precedence over offences against property for the purpose of determining the primary offence.

One Offence Counts Per Victim: One offence counts per victim involved with the exceptions of cheque/credit card fraud and burglary. Under certain circumstances, the cheque/credit card exception necessitates that a series of these offences counts as one crime where the originating bank ultimately suffers the loss. The burglary exception dictates that one burglary offence is counted where property belonging to two or more victims is stolen (or damaged) during a single burglary.

Continuous Series Involving the Same Victim and Same Offender: A continuous series of offences against the same victim involving the same offender counts as one offence.
