

Sharp increase in number of recorded murders

In the third quarter of 2007 there were 21 instances of Murder recorded by the Gardaí, an increase of 7 (+50%) on the corresponding period in 2006. There were no recorded instances of Manslaughter in Quarter 3, 2007 compared with 5 in the same quarter last year. Murder attempts and threats also increased significantly from 19 in the third quarter of 2006 to 51 in the most recent quarter.

In the 12-month period ending in the third quarter of 2007, the number of Murders increased by 11 (from 56 to 67) over the corresponding period ending in the third quarter of 2006 while the number of *Manslaughter* incidents fell by 8 (from 11 to 3) over the same period. See table 2.

There were 1,119 offences recorded as *Assault* in the third quarter of 2007, which represents a decrease of 9.3% on the same quarter of 2006. In the 12-month period ending in September, 2007, the total number of recorded Assault offences was 4,835, an increase of 287 (+6.3%) over the previous 12 months.

The results also show reductions in recorded offences classified as Sexual Offences (-8.1%), Thefts (-0.4%), Burglaries (-10.4%) and Robberies (-8.9%) in the 12-month period ending in Quarter 3, 2007. Over the same 12-month period there were increases in offences classified under Arson (+18.8%), Drugs (+28.8%) and *Frauds* (+30.1%). *Other Headline Offences* rose by 21.9%.

When analysed according to headline offence group the following trends can be observed between 2006 and 2007.

Group 01 - Homicides

The total number of *Homicide*-related offences rose from 38 in quarter 3, 2006 to 73 in quarter 3, 2007, an increase of just over 92%. The number of Murder/manslaughter offences increased slightly from 19 in the third quarter of 2006 to 21 in the most recent quarter. In the 12-month period ending in Q3, 2007, there were 156 incidents of Murder attempts/threats, compared to 101 incidents of this type in the same 12-month period ending in Q3, 2006 representing an increase of just under 55%.

Group 02 - Assaults

In the 12-month period ending in Q3, 2007, there was an increase in all offences which were classified under Assaults. There was an increase of 3% (from 3,813 to 3,926) in Assault causing harm in the 12-month period to the end of quarter 3 2007. The 12-month figure for Abduction to quarter 3 2007 was 34, an increase of 11 (+47.8%) on the 23 recorded for the same period ending quarter 3, 2006.

Group 03 - Sexual Offences

There were 1,548 *Sexual offences* recorded by the Gardaí in the 12-month period ending in the third quarter of 2007, compared with 1,684 in the 12-months to the same quarter last year, a decline of just over 8%. Incidents *of Rape of a Female* over the same period fell from 335 to 296 (-11.6%) while *Sexual assaults* fell by 98 or just under 11%.

Group 04 - Arson

There were 504 recorded incidents of *Arson* in Q3, 2007, an increase of 28 (+5.9%) on the same quarter last year. In the 12-month period ending in quarter 3, 2007, there were 1,912 incidents of *Arson*, compared with 1,609 over the previous 12 months, an increase of 18.8%.

Group 05 - Drugs

All offences in this category showed increases over the year. Overall, recorded headline drug offences in the 12-month period ending in Q3, 2007 rose by 967 (+28.8). The largest offence type in this category, *Possession of drugs for sale or supply*, increased by 737 (+26.2%) while recorded *Cultivation, manufacture or importation of drugs* offences increased by 68 (+54.8 %) over the same 12 month period.

Group 06 - Thefts

Offences in this category accounted for just over 56% of all headline offences in the 12-month period ending in the third quarter of 2007. Recorded *Thefts from person* were down by 18.2% (from 3,868 to 3,165) over the 12-month period.

Group 07 - Burglaries

Recorded offences categorised as *Burglary* accounted for 23,095 or 22.2% of the total of 103,929 headline offences in the 12-month period ending quarter 3, 2007. This represents a drop of 2,695 (-10.4%) from the previous 12 months.

Group 08 - Robberies

In the 12-month period ending in the third quarter of 2007, there were 212 (-8.9%) fewer incidents of recorded *Robbery* than in the previous 12 months. Within this category there were decreases in offences of *Robbery of an establishment/institution* (-28.1%) and *Robbery of cash/goods in transit* (-32.3%). However, instances of recorded *Robbery from the person* increased by 122 or just over 10% over the same period.

Group 09 - Frauds

There were 5,338 recorded incidents in this category in the 12-month period ending in the third quarter of 2007, representing an increase of 1,236 (+30.1%) from the previous 12-month period.


Group 10 - Other Headline Offences

Within the category of Other Headline Offences, the largest absolute change was in recorded instances of *Abandoning a child, child neglect and cruelty*. Offences of this type increased from 276 to 521 in the 12-month period to the end of quarter 3 2007.

Slight reduction in annualised total Headline crime

The annualised totals (i.e. the 12-month running total to the end of a quarter) increased consistently from the first quarter of 2005 to the second quarter of 2006. In the 12-month period ending the first quarter of 2005, the total number of offences recorded was 97,352, compared to 104,429 in the second quarter of 2006, representing an increase of over 7%. Subsequently, there was a steady decrease in the annualised number of recorded crimes to 102,215 in the first quarter of 2007, a decrease of just over 2%. Provisional figures for year ending the third quarter of 2007 indicate a slight increase to 103,929. *See table 1b and graph opposite*.

Background Notes

Introduction

The Headline Crime Statistics release provides provisional figures for the number of headline incidents recorded by An Garda Síochána. A retrospective quarterly series is given to the year 2004. Because of timing issues with respect to the extraction of data (which normally occurs a week after the end of a quarter) figures for the previous quarter are prone to subsequent revision. Also, because of other issues (particularly classification and counting procedures covered below) all data can be revised. This release gives the up-to-date situation for all periods covered.

Crime recording

Incidents reported or which become known to members of An Garda Síochána are recorded when, on the balance of probability, a Garda determines that a criminal offence defined by law has taken place and there is no credible evidence to the contrary. If it is subsequently determined that a criminal offence did not take place the criminal offence recorded is invalidated and is not counted in the statistics. If a person makes a report and subsequently withdraws it by stating that the criminal act did not take place then this too is invalidated unless there is evidence to suggest that by reasonable probability the offence has taken place. For criminal offences where victim confirmation is required (e.g. assault, fraud), a criminal offence is recorded only where the victim confirms the offence or where there is evidence to suggest that by reasonable probability it occurred.

Crime classification

A criminal offence is classified as a particular offence type at the initial recording of that offence. However, upon investigation, it may later become apparent that an alternative offence type should be used. In this event, the record is amended to reflect this. Re-classification on the basis of court proceedings only occurs in relation to homicide offences. A murder offence is reclassified as man-slaughter when a charge of manslaughter commences or when a murder charge results in a conviction for manslaughter. It is also possible, though more rare, that an incident originally classified as manslaughter may be re-classified as murder. Also, a re-classification to a homicide offence occurs when, for example, a serious assault has been recorded and, some time later, the victim dies as a consequence of the assault.

Headline offences

The quarterly figures consist of Headline Offences only, which is part of the classification used by the Gardaí since the year 2000. Included in the headline category are 99 offence types in all, which, in the Garda Annual Report come under the following headings: Homicides, Assaults, Sexual Offences, Arson, Drugs, Thefts, Burglaries, Robberies, Frauds and Other Headline Offences.

General counting rules

Crime counting rules are applied to all criminal offences for the purposes of the statistics. The following are the main rules relevant to the quarterly headline figures:

Primary Offence Rule: Where two or more criminal offences are disclosed in a single episode, it is the primary criminal offence that is counted. The primary offence is that offence which the greater penalty may apply. Where offences have similar penalties, offences against the person take precedence over offences against property for the purpose of determining the primary offence.

One Offence Counts Per Victim: One offence counts per victim involved with the exceptions of cheque/credit card fraud and burglary. Under certain circumstances, the cheque/credit card exception necessitates that a series of these offences counts as one crime where the originating bank ultimately suffers the loss. The burglary exception dictates that one burglary offence is counted where property belonging to two or more victims is stolen (or damaged) during a single burglary.

Continuous Series Involving the Same Victim and Same Offender: A continuous series of offences against the same victim involving the same offender counts as one offence.
