



Activities of Irish Psychiatric Units and Hospitals 2005

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Glossary

Central Mental Hospital

The Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum, is administered by the HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster but serves the country as a whole rather than a specified catchment area.

COMCAR

COMCAR is a HRB system which is designed to capture mental health information at community level. Activity at COMmunity CARE level is recorded across general adult psychiatry, psychiatry of later life, liaison psychiatry, child and adolescent services in the following service components: outpatient clinics, day centres, day hospitals, community residences and home visits.

Health Service Executive (HSE) Area

The address from which each patient was admitted to hospital was used to allocate the patient to a HSE area. Thus, tabulations relating to HSE areas were calculated irrespective of whether or not the patient was admitted to a hospital administered by that area. Data on patients admitted to private hospitals was returned to the area in which they normally resided. A map outlining each HSE administrative area and its respective catchment population according to the Census of Population 2002 (Central Statistics Office, 2003a) is presented at the end of Chapter 1.

Health Research Board (HRB)

The Health Research Board was established in 1986 (under Statutory Instrument No. 279); it promotes, assists, commissions and conducts medical, health, epidemiological and health services research in Ireland. The Board came into being on the amalgamation of two former bodies, the Medical Research Council and the Medico-Social Research Board (MSRB).

ICD-10

The diagnostic groups in this report are based on categories defined in the WHO's International Classification of Diseases (ICD-10) (WHO, 1992).

In-patient days

In-patient days were the number of days spent by patients in hospital from date of admission to date of discharge (see also Length of stay). It was calculated by subtracting the date of admission from the date of discharge including time spent on transfer for medical or surgical purposes while still 'on the books' of psychiatric units and hospitals.

Legal status

The legal status reported throughout this report is that recorded on admission. Changes may occur in legal status following admission but this is not recorded by the NPIRS.

Length of stay

Length of stay is the amount of time spent in hospital. It was calculated by subtracting the date of admission from the date of discharge, including time spent on transfer for medical or surgical purposes while still 'on the books' of psychiatric units and hospitals. It should be remembered that because of the existing legislative provisions a small number of involuntary patients may be discharged on trial but remain 'on the books' until formally discharged later.

Socio-economic group

Patients were allocated to one of eleven socio-economic groups (SEGs) according to the Classification of Occupations in the Census of Population 2002 (Central Statistics Office, 2003c). Socio-economic group was determined by a person's occupation, or their former occupation where the patient was unemployed or retired. If a patient was a student or engaged in house duties, the occupation of the head of household/spouse/guardian was used to determine socio-economic group. If such persons (students/or persons engaged in house duties) were not members of a family unit and/or were living alone (e.g. widowed grandparents etc) they were assigned to the unknown group.

Summary

This report presents data on all admissions to, discharges from and deaths in psychiatric in-patient facilities in Ireland in 2005. Data in this report was obtained from the National Psychiatric In-Patient Reporting System (NPIRS). Cross-sectional data is presented nationally, regionally (by HSE administrative area), locally (by county and by individual unit and hospital) and by hospital type. Rates reported throughout are per 100,000 of population aged 16 years and over.

- Admissions to Irish psychiatric units and hospitals continued to decline – from 29,392 admissions in 1986 to 21,253 admissions in 2005, representing a rate of 701.7 per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over. There were 5,917 first admissions, representing a rate of 195.4 per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over. Readmissions constituted 72% of all admissions.
- Males accounted for just over half of all admissions (51%) and first admissions (55%). The 45–54 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions, at 901.0 per 100,000, while the 20–24 year age group had the highest rate of first admission (211.4 per 100,000). Divorced persons had the highest rate of all admissions (947.0 per 100,000) and first admissions (273.8 per 100,000).
- In keeping with the pattern of previous years, the unskilled occupational group had the highest rate of all admissions (1,249.7 per 100,000) and first admissions (269.3 per 100,000), while own account workers had the lowest, at 104.6 and 31.7 per 100,000 respectively.
- Depressive disorders accounted for almost one-third (31%) of all admissions, schizophrenia accounted for 20%, alcoholic disorders accounted for 14% and mania accounted for 13%.
- There was no decline in the proportion of non-voluntary admissions at 11% of all and 12% of first admissions. Only 4% of admissions to private hospitals were non-voluntary.
- There were 21,265 discharges from Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2005.
- There were 229 deaths in Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2005.
- Forty-three per cent of those admitted with alcoholic disorders, 25% of those with depressive disorders and 18% of those with schizophrenia were discharged within one week. Almost all discharges for alcoholic disorders (99%), depressive disorders (96%) and schizophrenia (86%) occurred within three months of admission.
- Thirty per cent of all admissions were from HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster, 27% were from HSE South, 22% were from HSE West and 21% were from HSE Dublin North-East.
- The HSE South had the highest rate of all admissions (733.9 per 100,000) and first admissions (211.7 per 100,000), followed by HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 723.6 and 206.9. The HSE West had the lowest rate of all (652.6) and first (162.0) admissions.
- Admission rates for the unskilled group were highest across all areas, a trend in keeping with the high national rate of all and first admissions for this group.

- Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all and first admissions across all HSE areas.
- The HSE South had the highest rate of non-voluntary all admissions, at 88.9 per 100,000, while the HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster had the highest rate of non-voluntary first admissions, at 25.2 per 100,000 population.
- Over one quarter of all discharges in all HSE areas occurred within one week of admission and over 92% of all discharges in the four HSE areas occurred within three months of admission.
- The HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster had the longest average length of stay, at 28.4 days and accounted for the smallest proportion of discharges, at 21%. The HSE West had the shortest average length of stay, at 26.7 days.
- There were 63 admissions of non-residents in 2005.
- Forty-nine per cent of all admissions in 2005 were to general hospital psychiatric units, 32% were to psychiatric hospitals and 19% were to private hospitals. Sixty per cent of all admissions to the public sector (general hospital psychiatric units and psychiatric hospitals) were to general hospital psychiatric units.
- Private hospitals had a longer average length of stay, at 34.3 days, compared to 24.3 days for general hospital psychiatric units and 26.9 days for psychiatric hospitals. While the length of stay in private hospitals was longer than that of both general hospital psychiatric units and psychiatric hospitals, the proportion of readmissions to private hospitals was lower, at 64% compared to 73% to general hospital psychiatric units and 76% to psychiatric hospitals.
- There was an eleven-fold difference in first admission rates for alcoholic disorders between counties Monaghan (with the lowest rate, 7.5 per 100,000) and Wicklow (with the highest rate, 87.3 per 100,000).
- Over 40% of all admissions to St James's Hospital, Dublin, St Joseph's Hospital, Clonmel, Waterford Regional Hospital, the Mercy Hospital, Cork and Mayo General Hospital were for depressive disorders while one-third of admissions to Newcastle Hospital, Greystones were for alcoholic disorders.
- There were 62 admissions to children's centres in 2005, with 51 first admissions and 11 readmissions. Males accounted for 55% of admissions. Two-thirds of admissions were aged 14–15 years, with a further 11% aged 16 years. Thirty-six per cent of admissions to children's centres had a diagnosis of depressive disorders, with eating disorders accounting for 16%, and schizophrenia and neuroses each accounting for 11% of admissions.

1. Introduction and Background Information

We are pleased to present our annual report on the activities of Irish psychiatric services for the year 2005. The report presents data on all admissions to, discharges from and deaths in psychiatric in-patient facilities in Ireland in 2005. Cross-sectional data is presented nationally, regionally (by HSE administrative areas), locally (by county and by individual unit and hospital) and by hospital type. A range of classificatory variables is used to present the data – gender, age, marital status, socio-economic group, legal status, diagnosis and length of stay. Comparative figures for 2004 used throughout the report are from the publication *Activities of Irish Psychiatric Services 2004* (Daly *et al.*, 2005). Rates reported throughout are per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over. The figures for age in this report were based on non-truncated calculations whereas heretofore age was based on truncated calculations.¹

Data in this report was obtained from the National Psychiatric In-Patient Reporting System (NPIRS). The NPIRS database is the only national psychiatric in-patient database in Ireland and was established on the recommendation of the *Commission of Enquiry on Mental Illness* (Department of Health, 1966). It has been maintained by the Medico-Social Research Board (MSRB), and subsequently by the Health Research Board (HRB), since 1971. Since 1965, the publication of annual reports (*Activities of Irish Psychiatric Services*) from the NPIRS data has continued to play a central role in the planning of service delivery. National and regional newsletters, capturing data from the HSE administrative areas, are also produced from the database.

The NPIRS database structure is also used as the basis for decennial censuses of the in-patient population, the most recent of which was in 2001 (Daly and Walsh, 2002). Because of the accelerated move to the provision of community-based services it was felt that an earlier appreciation of the impact of such changes on in-patient resident numbers and characteristics was needed; and, accordingly, a census was carried out on 31 March 2006. The results of this census will be published by the end of 2006.

The establishment of the National Mental Health Performance Indicators Working Group, which requires the submission of selected performance indicators (PIs) of mental health services to the Department of Health and Children on a quarterly basis, has led to more timely and accurate return of NPIRS data to the Health Research Board. In addition, the recent health strategy document, *Quality and Fairness: A Health Strategy for You* (Department of Health and Children, 2001a) has emphasised the need for service planning and delivery to be based on high-quality, reliable and timely information. This, along with the return of performance indicator data on a quarterly basis, has, to date, ensured more timely return of data and, in addition, ensured that data pertaining to the in-patient services on a national and regional basis are current and therefore, can play a more central role in service planning and delivery.

¹ The figures for age in this report were not rounded up, as they were in previous reports. For example, all 17-year-olds are now counted as 17-year-olds whereas in the past those over 17.5 years were counted as 18-year-olds, and so on for other age groups. These truncated calculations affected only those in the upper and lower end of each group i.e. 15 year olds in the under 16 age group, 16 and 19 year age group and so on.

As part of our quality improvement initiatives and continued good relations with our stakeholders we have included in this year's report an evaluation form on which stakeholders can rate the overall usefulness of the report and identify any other items that they would like to see covered in the report.

Finally, additional analysis of the data is available from the MHRD upon request.

Data coverage and collection

Data on admissions to, and discharges from general hospital psychiatric units, psychiatric hospitals, private hospitals, children's centres and the Central Mental Hospital are included in this report. A breakdown of hospital type is presented in Table 1.1.

Data for the NPIRS was returned quarterly to the Mental Health Research Division of the Health Research Board either electronically or manually, according to agreed specifications. In 2005, 88% of admissions data (excluding children's data) was returned in electronic format. The HRB Patient Administration System (PAS) was installed in one additional hospital in 2005.

With the manual system, completed forms are returned to personnel at the Health Research Board in accordance with procedures and practices established over a number of years. Personnel at the Health Research Board code and process the data and maintain ongoing liaison with hospital personnel. The admission and discharge form used to collect data from hospitals is presented in Appendix 1.

Limitations

While the Mental Health Research Division (MHRD) is continually engaged in quality improvement initiatives concerning data collection and validation, a number of limitations to the data should be noted.

Some services diagnose patients on discharge rather than on admission, so diagnostic data is not available for admissions to those services who had not been discharged by the end of the year in which they were admitted. One private service has excluded undiagnosed admissions from its annual returns to the HRB. For these reasons, the true number of admissions may not be accurately reflected in the report.

The collection of information relating to socio-economic group continues to pose a major problem for many units and hospitals. In 2005, 8,794 admissions (41% of the total of 21,253) were returned with unknown occupation, rendering assignment to a socio-economic group impossible. This is a slight improvement on 2004 figures (43% occupation unknown) showing some positive results from the MHRD's continuous initiatives to improve the quality of information received.

The issue of recording data on patients who are transferred between units and hospitals has been a perennial problem for many hospitals. The difficulties have been accentuated by the increasing number of catchments where there are both psychiatric hospitals and general hospital psychiatric units and transfers occur between the two. This is in addition to transfers from one catchment to another and of the small number of transfers to the Central Mental Hospital from mental health services. This issue was addressed at a training seminar during which the HRB policy concerning how transfers should be dealt with was outlined.

Transfers to general hospitals for medical, surgical or other treatment are not required for HRB reporting purposes as it would lead to the loss of valuable length of stay information given that, while in the general hospital for this purpose, patients, unless discharged, remain 'on the books' of the transferring hospital. As some difficulties in recording and returning transfer information persist the HRB is examining approaches to resolving the matter.

The figures presented for admissions and discharges represent episodes or events rather than persons. Thus, one person may have several admissions during the course of a year and each admission is recorded separately. One of the recommendations of the policy document *A Vision for Change* (Report of the Expert Group on Mental Health Policy, 2006) was for the introduction of an electronic patient record (EPR) with a unique identifier for every individual in the state. The availability of a unique individual identifier such as the Personal Public Service Number (PPSN) would ensure greater integrity of data, allow us to distinguish between individuals and events and provide longitudinal analysis of data; this would enable more effective planning of services. In addition, *A Vision for Change* pointed out that a unique identifier is 'essential to facilitate effective epidemiological research'.

Admissions do not necessarily represent the incidence of mental illness but rather the activity in in-patient services. There may be considerable differences in admission rates from service to service, but this does not necessarily indicate variations in incidence and may simply reflect differing admission practices.

Legal status

Throughout this report, the legal status referred to is that recorded at the time of a patient's admission. In some cases, changes in legal status may occur subsequent to admission but these changes are not recorded by the NPIRS.

The Central Mental Hospital receives patients from two sources.

- Under the provisions of section 207 of the Mental Treatment Act 1945 (Department of Health, 1945) detained patients can be transferred to the Hospital while remaining 'on the books' of the transferring hospital; and more recently by a judgment of the Supreme Court, section 208 of the Act can also be used for this purpose. Such transfers will continue with the introduction of the Mental Health Act 2001 (Department of Health & Children, 2001b).
- Under separate legislation (Criminal Lunatics (Ireland) Act 1838, as amended by the Criminal Justice Act, 1960 and other legislation) prisoners can be transferred to the Central Mental Hospital.

In this report, data regarding these transfers from both sources is grouped together and presented as admissions to the Central Mental Hospital rather than as transfers. The legislative provisions governing the transfer of prisoners to the Central Mental Hospital allow broadly for transfer on a voluntary (hospital order) or compulsory (ministerial order) basis. Whereas up to now previous reports have returned all transfers to the hospital as involuntary, in future prison transfers will be differentiated on this basis.

Computation of rates

The rates accompanying numerical data in this report were calculated using the *Census of Population 2002* (Central Statistics Office, 2003a; Central Statistics Office, 2003b; Central Statistics Office, 2003c). All data was rated to the population aged 16 years and over.

Health Service Executive Areas

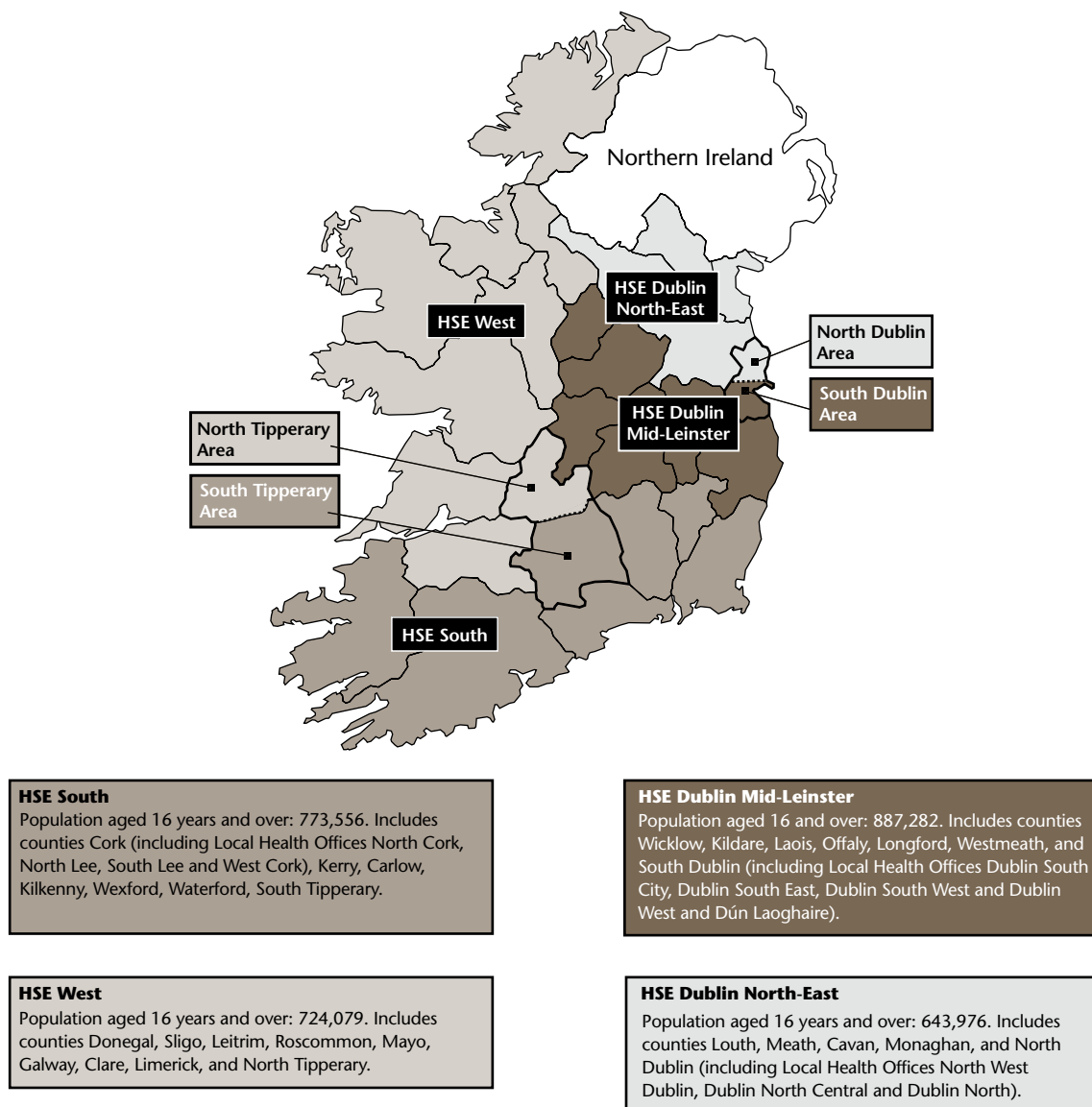


Figure 1.1 Health Service Executive Administrative Areas 2005

In 2005, new Health Service Executive (HSE) administrative areas replaced the former health board areas. The four HSE areas are Dublin North-East, Dublin Mid-Leinster, South, and West (Figure 1.1).

HSE West services the Northern and Western parts of the country and replaces the former Western, Mid-Western, and North-Western Health Boards.

HSE Dublin North-East includes the regions previously covered by the North-Eastern Health Board and the Northern Area Health Board of the Eastern Regional Health Authority.

HSE South replaces the former Southern and South-Eastern Health Boards.

HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster services the areas previously covered by the Midland Health Board, and the East Coast and the South Western Area Health Boards of the Eastern Regional Health Authority. Counties Dublin and Tipperary are each divided into two different HSE areas. South Dublin, including Local Health Offices Dublin South City, Dublin South East, Dublin South West and Dublin West and Dún Laoghaire (formerly Community Care Areas 1-5), falls into HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster,

while North Dublin, including Local Health Offices Dublin North West, Dublin North Central and Dublin North (formerly Community Care Areas 6-8), is serviced by HSE Dublin North-East. South Tipperary is serviced by HSE South and North Tipperary is serviced by HSE Western. Population figures for the HSE administrative areas are presented below in Table 1.2. As can be seen, the four HSE areas are roughly equal in terms of population numbers aged 16 years and over.

Diagnosis

The diagnostic groups in this report are based on categories defined in the WHO's *International Classification of Diseases* (ICD-10) (WHO, 1992) and are presented in Table 1.3. From 2004 the ICD-10 diagnostic codes were reclassified into new, more appropriate groupings, some of which are not entirely comparable with diagnostic categories used prior to the 2004 report. Only three of the new categories are directly comparable to the old categories: alcoholic disorders, other drug disorders, and intellectual disability.

Eating disorders, development disorders and behavioural emotional disorders of childhood and adolescence are presented as individual entities whereas previously these three categories were included with the neuroses and personality groupings. However, it should be pointed out that organic, schizophrenic, depressive and manic conditions arising in childhood and adolescence are included in the 'F' codes appropriate to these disorders and are not presented as disorders of childhood and adolescence. As current mental health legislation stands, childhood and adolescence extends only to age 16; however, when the 2001 Mental Health Act (Department of Health and Children, 2001) is operationalised in its entirety later this year, this will be extended to age 18. It is therefore the case that admissions of persons over age 16 were included in the categorisation of childhood and adolescence behavioural and emotional disorders, although these were very few in number. Finally, ICD-10 uses the term 'mental retardation' but our grouping is 'intellectual disability' to accord with current Irish usage.

COMCAR

Despite recommendations from successive government reports for the movement from traditional in-patient care to more community-based services, there is still a considerable lack of national information on community mental health services, and this is particularly problematic given that the most recent *Mental Health Act 2001* (Department of Health & Children, 2001b) reiterated the case for a move from in-patient care to care in the community. In order to ensure effective planning and the development and monitoring of community care mental health services, high quality data is needed in real time.

In response to this requirement, the HRB developed a Microsoft Access database called COMCAR (COMMunity CARE) in 2003. Activity at **COM**munity **CAR**e level is recorded across general adult psychiatry, psychiatry of later life, liaison psychiatry, child and adolescent services in the following service components: out-patient clinics, day centres, day hospitals, community residences and home visits. In 2005 the HRB undertook a review of the database applications used by the Mental Health Research Division (MHRD). This review looked at ways of developing a stable, robust and extensible system and recommended a web-based application that could combine both in-patient data and community care activity. After a selective tendering process, the HRB selected and appointed a software company to develop the NPIRS/COMCAR web-based application.

The types of data collected and the functionality of NPIRS/COMCAR include:

- The ability to record a service user's activity across the mental health services – including in-patient, out-patient, day hospital, day centre, home visits and community residences;
- A variety of patient demographic details including unique patient/client identifiers, name, address, sector, gender, socio-economic group etc.;
- The ability to create reports on a wide variety of areas across the mental health services including number of attendances, diagnosis of attendances, number of 'Did Not Attend's' (DNAs). Users will have the ability to create their own reports. The system will provide information for national reporting requirements – for example, Performance Indicators, HRB National Reports and Mental Health Commission.

A primary requirement in the development of NPIRS/COMCAR is that information recorded in the database could be transferred to and from any future IT system (integrated patient management system) planned for implementation nationally throughout the healthcare services. Another requirement in the development of NPIRS/COMCAR is the ability to migrate existing data from both the COMCAR and NPIRS systems to the new database.

NPIRS/COMCAR will allow for the integration of in-patient data within the various community service components – thus enabling a complete record of a patient's interaction with all of the mental health services. NPIRS/COMCAR will also allow users more flexible access to data and deliver more flexible reporting. The HSE's Mental Health and ICT Directorate and the HRB are working together to ensure a phased national roll-out of NPIRS/COMCAR. The first phase implementation has already commenced.

2. National and Regional (HSE Area) Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

National all and first admissions

In 2005 there were 21,253 admissions to Irish psychiatric units and hospitals, a rate of 701.7 per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over¹ (Table 2.1 and Table 2.2. – all tables referred to in this chapter are presented at the end of the chapter). There were 5,917 first admissions, a rate of 195.4 per 100,000 aged 16 years and over.² Readmissions accounted for over 72% of all admissions in 2005, a rate of 506.3 per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

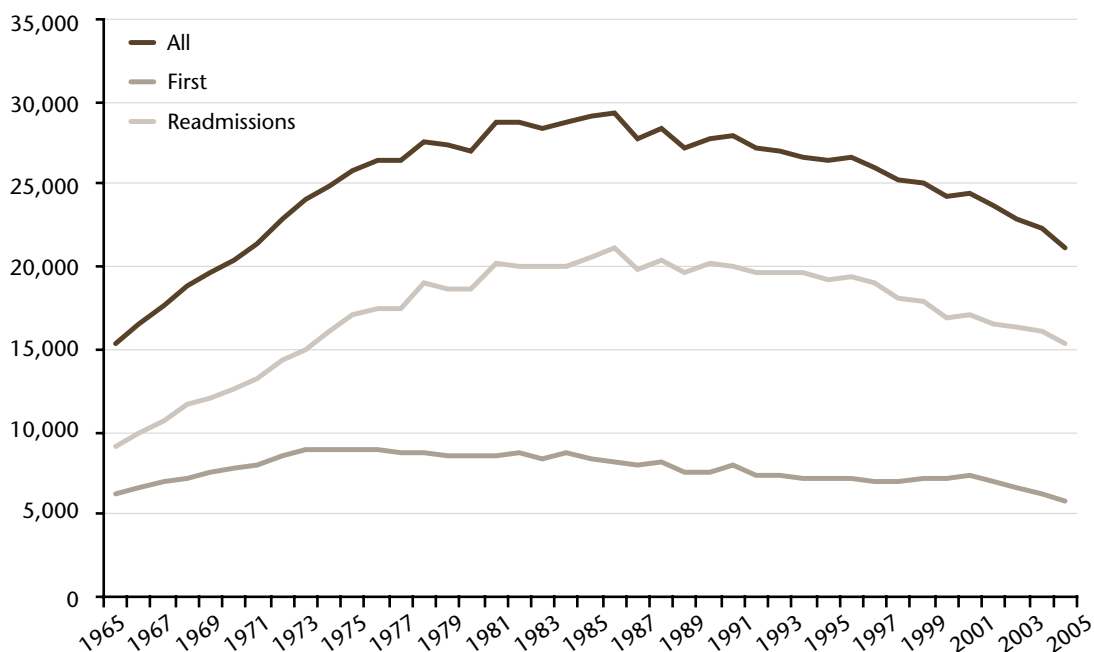


Figure 2.1 All, first and readmissions. Ireland 1965-2005.

Although admission numbers over the last forty years have increased from 15,440 in 1965 to 21,253 in 2005, reaching a peak of 29,392 in 1986, they have been steadily declining since the late 1980s (Figure 2.1 and Table 2.1). As can be seen from Figure 2.1, readmissions have shown a similar pattern of decline to all admissions, whereas first admissions have remained relatively unchanged over the last 40 years.

¹ All rates reported refer to populations aged 16 years and over as we are presenting data that relate almost exclusively to adult services. However, when expressed as rates per total population, the all admission rate was 542.6 per 100,000.

² The first admission rate expressed as rates per total population was 151.1 per 100,000.

Males accounted for just over half of all admissions (51%) and first admissions (55%) and had a higher rate of all and first admissions compared to females (Table 2.3). The 45–54 age group had the highest rate of all admissions, at 901.0, while the 20–24 age group had the highest rate of first admissions, at 211.4 per 100,000 (Table 2.4 and Table 2.5).³ Divorced persons had the highest rate of all (947.0) and first (273.8) admissions (Table 2.6). In keeping with the pattern of previous years, the unskilled occupational group had the highest rate of all (1,249.7) and first (269.3) admissions, while own account workers had the lowest, at 104.6 and 31.7 respectively (Table 2.7 and Table 2.8). All and first admission rates were highest for depressive disorders, at 215.8 and 66.6 per 100,000 population respectively (Table 2.9 and Table 2.10). Depressive disorders accounted for 30% of all admissions, schizophrenia accounted for 20% and alcoholic disorders accounted for 14%. Non-voluntary admissions accounted for 11% of all and 12% of first admissions (Table 2.11).

There were 154 admissions returned relating to patients with no fixed abode. Of these, 83% were males and 69% were single. Alcoholic disorders and depressive disorders each accounted for 24% of these admissions, while schizophrenia accounted for 21%.

National discharges and deaths

There were 21,265 discharges and 229 deaths in Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2005 (Table 2.15). This was a reduction in the number of discharges (21,938 discharges) but a slight increase in the number of deaths (226) from 2004.

Of the 229 deaths, 136 were male (59%) and 93 were female (41%). Almost half (49%) of those who died were aged 75 years and over, while 77% were aged 65 years and over (Table 2.15).

Length of stay

Forty-seven per cent of all discharges occurred within two weeks of admission, while 2% of discharges occurred after one year or more in hospital (Table 2.16). The recent increasing trend towards shorter episodes of in-patient care continued with 68% of all discharges occurring within four weeks of admission and 93% occurring within three months of admission.

Forty-three per cent of those admitted with alcoholic disorders, 25% of those with depressive disorders and 18% of those with schizophrenia were discharged within one week (Table 2.16). Almost all discharges for alcoholic disorders (99%), depressive disorders (96%) and schizophrenia (86%) occurred within three months of admission.

For example, all 17-year-olds are now counted as 17-year-olds whereas in the past those over 17.5 years were counted as 18-year-olds, and so on for other age groups. These truncated calculations affected only those in the upper and lower end of each age group i.e. 15 year olds in the under 16 age group, 16 and 19 year olds in the 16–19-year age group and so on.

Legal status

Twenty-nine per cent of voluntary admissions were discharged within one week compared to 12% of those admitted non-voluntarily (Table 2.17). Half of those admitted voluntarily were discharged within two weeks of admission compared to 23% of those admitted non-voluntarily.

In-patient days

Examination of in-patient days is presented in Table 2.18. Patients with a length of stay of one year or more were excluded from this analysis as they distort the number of bed days considerably – 2% of discharges were thus excluded. Twenty-eight per cent of discharges were following stays of less than one week, accounting for 3% of in-patient days and an average length of stay of 3.2 days. The average length of stay was 27.1 days, and the median length of stay was 14 days.

While discharges for development disorders had the longest average length of stay at 66 days, these discharges accounted for less than 1% of all discharges (9 discharges) (Table 2.19). Organic mental disorders had the second-longest average length of stay, at 44.6 days, followed by eating disorders, at 43.9 days, yet these disorders accounted for just 2% and 0.8% respectively of all discharges. Alcoholic disorders had the shortest average length of stay, at 14.7 days.

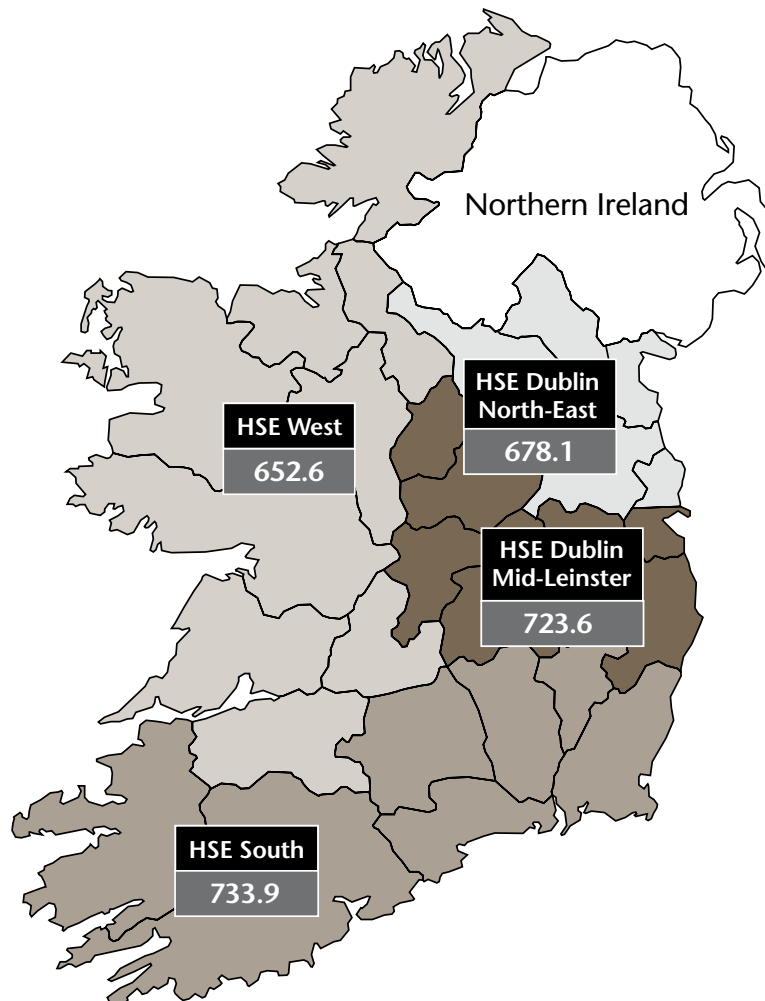
All and first admissions

On 1 January 2005 the new HSE areas replaced the former health board areas. Data is presented for the four HSE areas (Dublin North-East, Dublin Mid-Leinster, South, and West).

Thirty per cent of all admissions were from HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster, 27% were from HSE South, 22% were from HSE West and 21% were from HSE Dublin North-East.

The HSE South (South-Eastern and Southern areas) had the highest rate of all (733.9) and first admissions (211.7), followed by HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster (Midland, East Coast and South-Western areas), at 723.6 and 206.9 per 100,000 population (Table 2.3, Figure 2.2 and Figure 2.3). All and first admission rates in these areas were in excess of the national all (701.7) and first (195.4) admission rates. The HSE West (Mid-Western, North-Western and Western areas) had the lowest rate of all (652.6) and first (162.0) admissions (Table 2.3, Figure 2.2 and Figure 2.3).

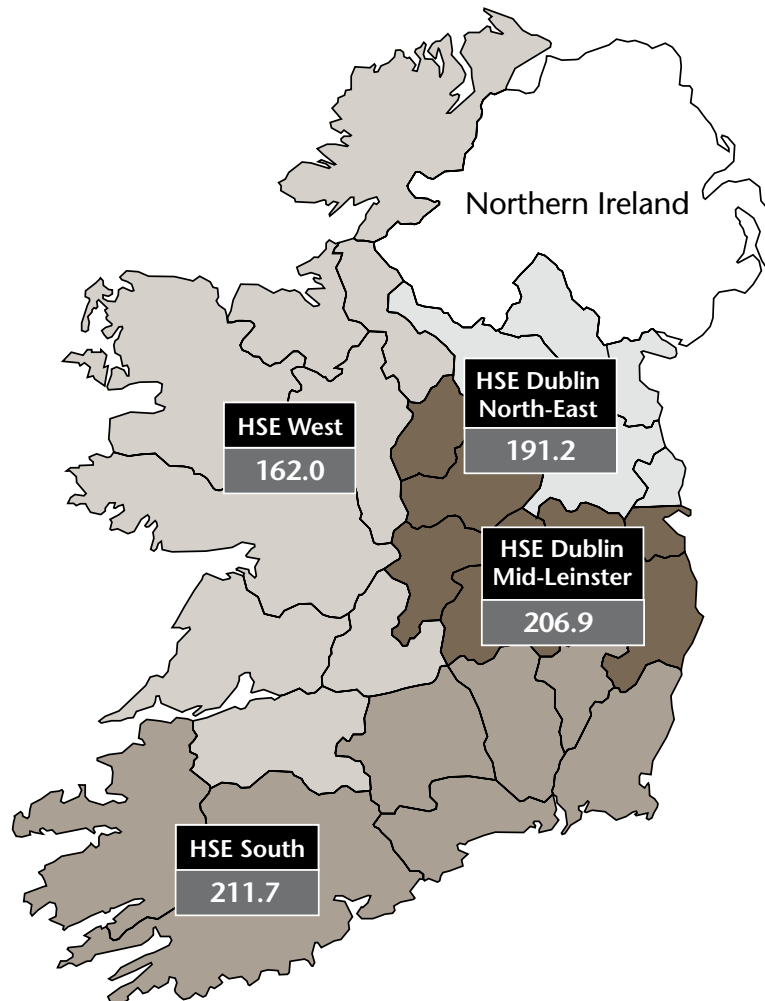

Gender and age

Males had the highest rate of admission in all areas compared to females with rates ranging from 786.1 in the HSE South to 682.1 per 100,000 population in the HSE Dublin North-East (Table 2.3). The male rate of admission in the HSE South was in excess of the national rate of admission for males, at 726.0 per 100,000. Males also had the highest rate of first admission in all areas compared to females with rates ranging from 239.5 in the HSE South to 186.5 in the HSE West. The male rates of first admission in the HSE South and Dublin Mid-Leinster were in excess of the national first admission rate for males, at 218.4 per 100,000.

Admission rates for age groups in the 16–44 age range were highest in the HSE South, while rates for groups in the 45–75 and over age range were highest in the HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster (Table 2.4). A similar pattern was observed for first admission rates (Table 2.5). Of particular interest is the decline in all admission rates among the elderly particularly in the HSE West where the rate for the 65–74 age group was 533.3 per 100,000 and that for the 75 and over age group was 330.3 per 100,000. This pattern was not seen in first admissions where there was a higher rate for the 75 and over age group in the Dublin North-East, South and Dublin Mid-Leinster compared to those for the 65–74 and 55–64 age groups.

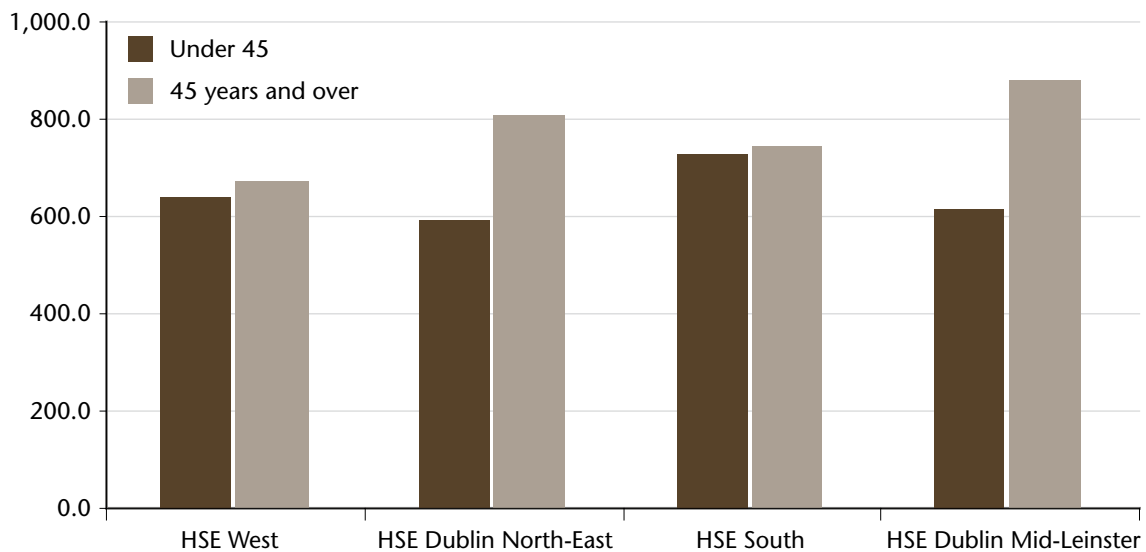


Figure 2.4 Health Service Executive Administrative Areas. All admissions by age category. Ireland 2005. Rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

When age groups were condensed into two groups, (under 45 years and 45 years and over), the 45 and over age group was found to have the highest rate of admission in all areas, with rates ranging from 883.0 in HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster to 670.2 per 100,000 in HSE West (Figure 2.4).

Marital status

Single persons had the highest rate of all admissions in HSE West and Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 916.4 and 871.3 per 100,000 population respectively (Table 2.6). Divorced persons had the highest rate in HSE Dublin North-East and South, at 984.9 and 1,248.5 respectively.

A similar pattern was observed for first admissions. Widowed persons, however, had the highest rate of first admissions in HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 263.5 per 100,000 population.

Socio-economic group

Admission rates for the unskilled group were highest across all areas, a trend in keeping with the high national rate of all and first admissions for this group (Table 2.7 and Table 2.8). Rates ranged from 1,545.0 in HSE West to 943.8 per 100,000 in HSE Dublin North-East. All and first admission rates for own account workers were lowest across all areas.

Diagnosis

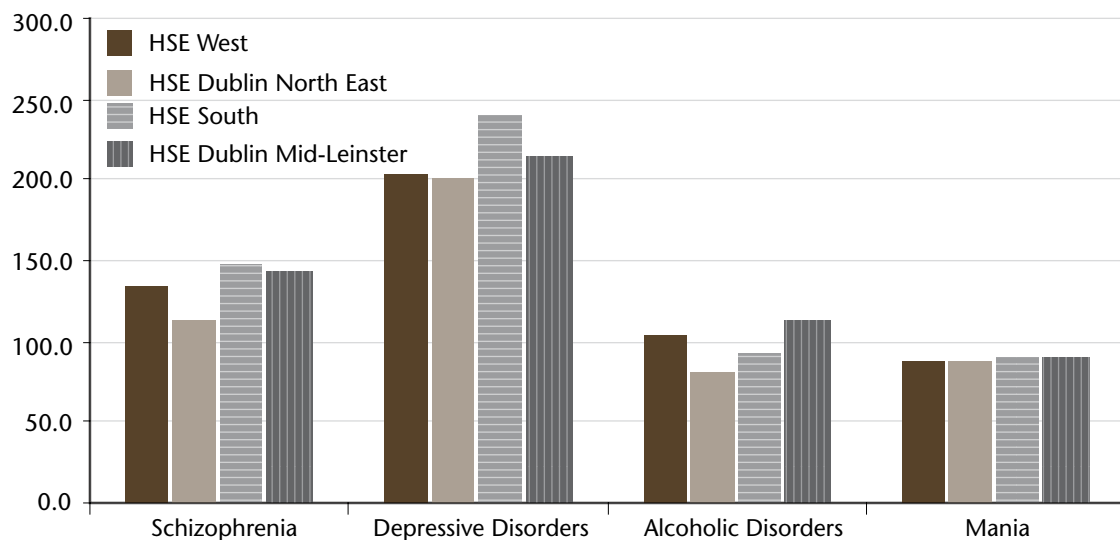


Figure 2.5 Health Service Executive Administrative Areas. All admissions by selected diagnoses. Ireland 2005. Rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

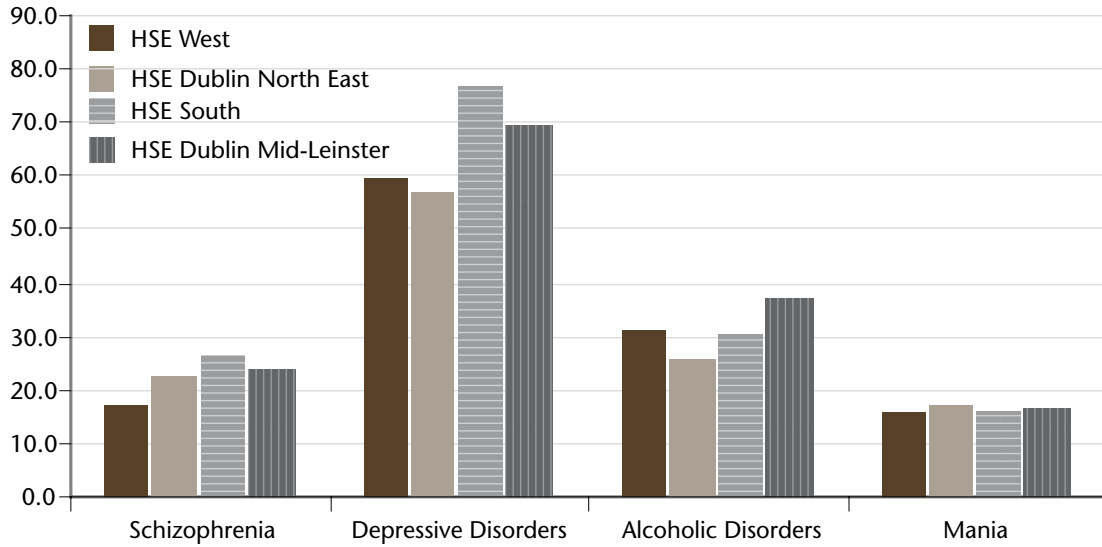


Figure 2.6 Health Service Executive Administrative Areas. First admissions by selected diagnoses. Ireland 2005. Rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all and first admissions across all HSE areas with rates for all admissions ranging from 239.8 in HSE South to 201.9 in HSE Dublin North-East (Table 2.9, Table 2.10, and Figure 2.5). Rates for first admissions ranged from 77.0 in HSE South to 56.8 per 100,000 in HSE Dublin North-East (Table 2.10 and Figure 2.6).

Schizophrenia accounted for the second-highest rate of all admissions in all HSE areas, with rates ranging from 148.3 in HSE South to 114.0 per 100,000 in HSE Dublin North-East (Figure 2.5).

Alcoholic disorders had the second-highest rate of first admissions in all HSE areas with rates ranging from 37.0 in HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster to 26.1 per 100,000 in HSE Dublin North-East (Figure 2.6).

Legal status

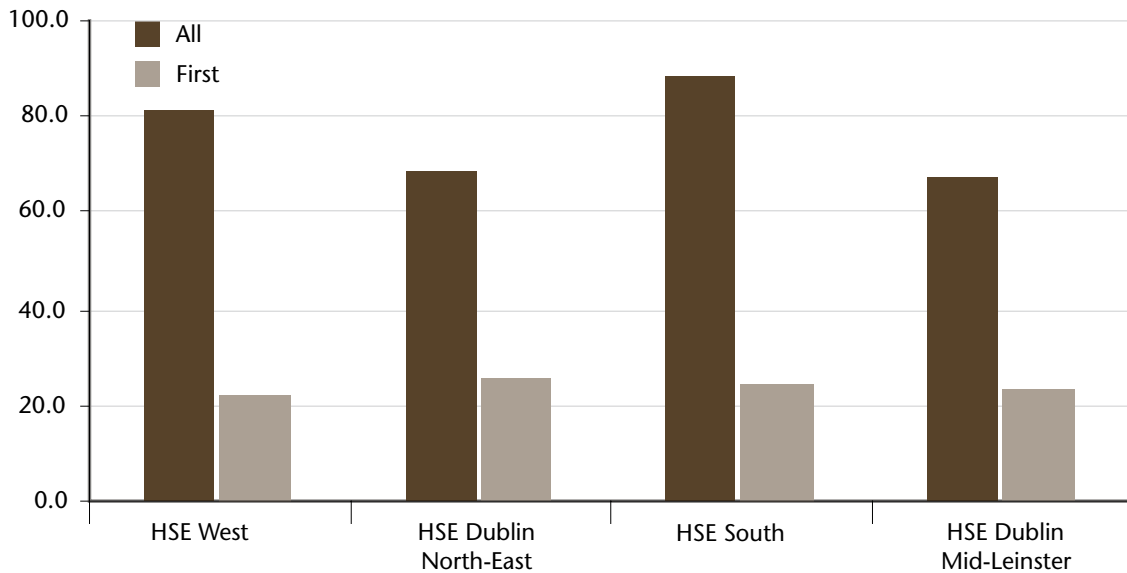


Figure 2.7 Health Service Executive Administrative Areas. Non-voluntary all and first admissions. Ireland 2005. Rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

HSE South had the highest rate of non-voluntary admissions, at 88.9 per 100,000, followed by HSE West, at 81.2 (Table 2.11 and Figure 2.7). Rates for both the HSE South and West were in excess of the national rate for non-voluntary admissions of 76.7 per 100,000 population. HSE Dublin North-East had the highest rate of non-voluntary first admissions, at 25.2, followed by HSE South, at 24.8 per 100,000.

Length of stay

There was very little difference in the proportion of discharges within one week in all four HSE areas, ranging from 29% in HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster to 25% in HSE West (Table 2.12). Over 92% of all discharges in the four HSE areas occurred within three months of admission.

HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster accounted for 30% of all discharges and of in-patient days and had the second-shortest average length of stay, at 26.8 days (Table 2.14). HSE Dublin North-East had the longest average length of stay, at 28.4 days, and accounted for the smallest proportion of discharges, at 21%. HSE West had the shortest average length of stay, at 26.7 days.

Non-residents

There were 63 admissions for non-residents in 2005. This is a reduction in the number admitted in 2004 (78). The designation of a person as 'non-resident' is determined by the address given at the time of admission and it is therefore more likely to apply to persons who have recently arrived in Ireland.

Thirty-five per cent of those admitted as non-residents had an address originating in England, with an additional 35% originating in Northern Ireland. Ten per cent were from Scotland and 5% were from the USA (Table 2.20). Thirty-five per cent of non-residents had a diagnosis of mania, 24% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders and 22% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia (Table 2.21).

3. Hospital Type – Admissions and Discharges

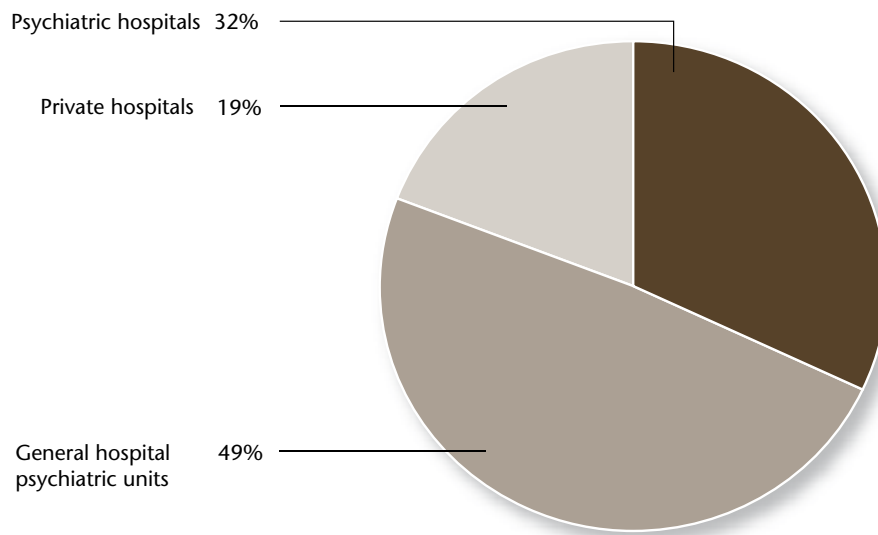


Figure 3.1 Hospital type. All admissions. Ireland 2005. Percentages.

Forty-nine per cent of admissions in 2005 were to general hospital psychiatric units, 32% were to psychiatric hospitals and 19% were to private hospitals (Table 3.1 and Figure 3.1 – all tables referred to in this chapter are presented at the end of the chapter). There has been a gradual reduction in the proportion of admissions to psychiatric hospitals in the last three years from 38% in 2003 to 32% in 2005, with a corresponding increase in the proportion admitted to general hospital psychiatric units (44% in 2003). There was a slight increase in the proportion of admissions to private hospitals from 18% in 2004 to 19% in 2005.

Readmissions accounted for 76% of admissions to psychiatric hospitals, 73% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 64% of admissions to private hospitals.

Gender and age

More than half of those admitted to general hospital psychiatric units (51%) and psychiatric hospitals (55%) were male, while 57% of those admitted to private hospitals were female (Table 3.1).

One fifth of those admitted to general hospital psychiatric units and psychiatric hospitals were aged 25–34 years compared to 13% to private hospitals (Table 3.2).¹ Private hospitals had a higher proportion of admissions aged 45–64 years (41%) compared to either general hospital psychiatric units (32%) or psychiatric hospitals (33%). A similar pattern was observed for first admissions.

¹ The figures for age in this report were not rounded up, as they were in previous reports. For example, all 17-year-olds are now counted as 17-year-olds whereas in the past those over 17.5 years were counted as 18-year-olds, and so on for other age groups. These truncated calculations affected only those in the upper and lower end of each group i.e. 15 year olds in the under 16 age group, 16 and 19 year age group and so on.

Marital status

Single persons accounted for 58% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, 55% of admissions to psychiatric hospitals and 40% of admissions to private hospitals (Table 3.3). Married persons accounted for a higher proportion of admissions to private hospitals, at 44% compared to general hospital psychiatric units (24%) and psychiatric hospitals (23%).

Socio-economic group

A larger proportion of admissions to private hospitals were for higher (8%) and lower professionals (15%) compared to general hospital psychiatric units (2% and 5% respectively) and psychiatric hospitals (1% and 4% respectively) (Table 3.4). A larger proportion of employers and managers were admitted to private hospitals, at 10%, compared to both general hospital psychiatric units, at 2% and psychiatric hospitals, at 1%. The unskilled group accounted for a higher proportion of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, at 12% and psychiatric hospitals, at 10%, compared to private hospitals, at 2%.

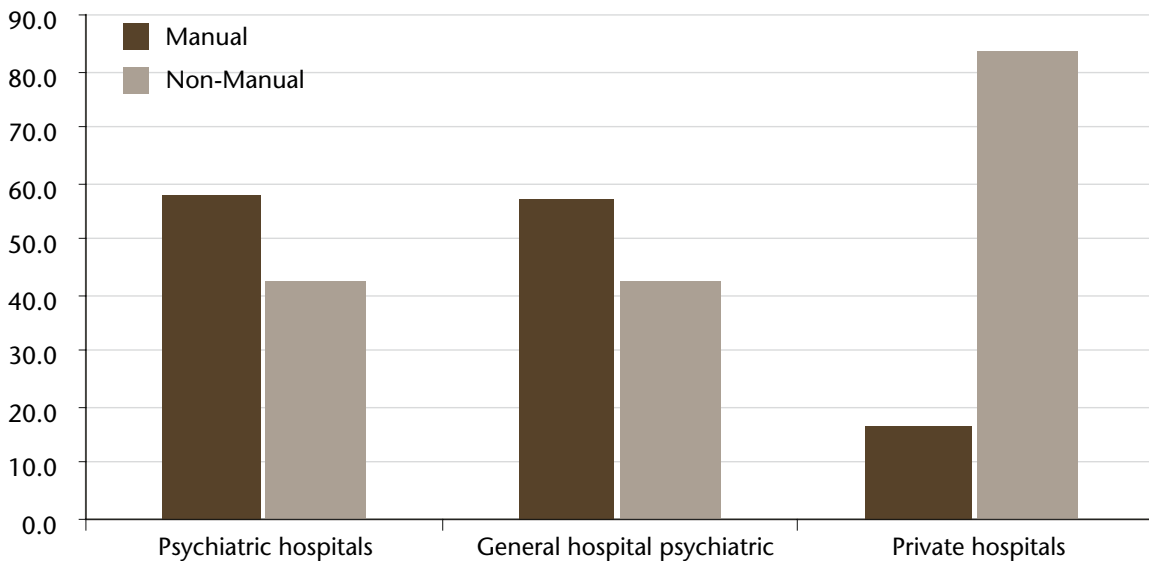


Figure 3.2 Hospital type. Manual and non-manual occupations.^a Ireland 2005. Percentages.

Socio-economic group was reclassified into manual and non-manual occupations. Fifty-eight per cent of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 57% of admissions to psychiatric hospitals had manual occupations compared to 15% of admissions to private hospitals (Figure 3.2). Non-manual occupations accounted for 83% of admissions to private hospitals.

Diagnosis

More than one-fifth of those admitted to general hospital psychiatric units (22%) and psychiatric hospitals (23%) had a diagnosis of schizophrenia compared to 8% admitted to private hospitals (Table 3.6). A higher proportion of admissions to private hospitals (20%) were for alcoholic disorders compared to general hospital psychiatric units (11%) and psychiatric hospitals (16%). Similarly, a higher proportion of admissions to private hospitals were for mania (17%) compared to general hospital psychiatric units (12%) and psychiatric hospitals (11%). Similar patterns were observed for first admissions (Table 3.7).

Legal status

Non-voluntary admissions accounted for 14% of admissions to psychiatric hospitals, 12% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 4% of admissions to private hospitals (Table 3.8). Non-voluntary first admissions accounted for 18% of admissions to psychiatric hospitals, 13% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 5% of admissions to private hospitals.

Length of stay

Over 30% of discharges from general hospital psychiatric units and psychiatric hospitals (32%) occurred within one week of admission compared to 12% of discharges from private hospitals (Table 3.9). Over half of all discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (52%) and psychiatric hospitals (53%) occurred within two weeks of admission compared to 25% from private hospitals.

Private hospitals had a longer average length of stay, at 34.3 days, compared to general hospital psychiatric units, at 24.3 days and psychiatric hospitals, at 26.9 days (Table 3.10). While the length of stay in private hospitals was longer than that of both general hospital psychiatric units and psychiatric hospitals, the proportion of readmissions to private hospitals was lower, at 64% compared to 73% to general hospital psychiatric units and 76% to psychiatric hospitals (Table 3.1).

4. Individual Units and Hospitals – Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

All and first admissions for individual catchment areas with their respective catchment populations are presented in Table 4.1 – other tables referred to in this chapter are presented at the end of the chapter). Units and hospitals in Wicklow had the highest rate of all (891.2) admissions, followed by units and hospitals in Waterford, at 885.5 and Tipperary, at 835.5 per 100,000 population. Meath had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 263.8 per 100,000 population.

Units and hospitals in Waterford had the highest rate of first admissions, at 307.1 per 100,000 population, followed by Wexford, at 276.7 and Wicklow at 247.1 per 100,000. Units and hospitals in Dún Laoghaire had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 42.4 per 100,000.

Diagnosis

All admission rates for alcoholic disorders were highest for Wicklow, at 299.7 per 100,000, followed by Wexford, at 213.2 and East Galway Services,^b at 177.9 per 100,000 (Table 4.3). There was a twenty-fold difference between the admission rate for alcoholic disorders in Wicklow (299.7) and that in Cavan/Monaghan, at 14.5 per 100,000 population. Over one-third (34%) of all admissions to Newcastle Hospital, Greystones were for alcoholic disorders (Table 4.12).

Units and hospitals in Wicklow had the highest rate of all admissions for schizophrenia, at 172.2 per 100,000, followed by Dublin South East, at 171.9 and Longford/Westmeath, at 170.3 per 100,000 population. There was a three-fold difference between the highest rate for schizophrenia in Wicklow (172.2) and that in Meath, at 48.7.

All admission rates for depressive disorders were highest for units and hospitals in Waterford, at 404.4 per 100,000, followed by North Lee services, at 325.4 and units and hospitals in Tipperary, at 316.8 per 100,000. There was a five-fold difference between the admission rate for depressive disorders in Waterford (404.4) and that in Meath, at 70.0 per 100,000 population. Over 40% of all admissions to a number of hospitals were for depressive disorders, 49% in St James's Hospital, Dublin, 40% in St Joseph's Hospital, Clonmel, 48% in Waterford Regional Hospital, 54% in the Mercy Hospital, Cork and 52% in Mayo General Hospital (Table 4.11).

First admission rates for alcoholic disorders were highest for Wicklow, at 85.4 per 100,000, followed by Wexford, at 74.9 and East Galway, at 57.5. Over one-third (35%) of first admissions to Newcastle Hospital, Greystones were for alcoholic disorders (Table 4.15).

Units and hospitals in Kerry had the highest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 39.5 followed by Dublin South City, at 34.0 and North West Dublin, at 32.3 per 100,000.

Units and hospitals in Waterford had the highest rate of first admissions for depressive disorders, at 148.4 per 100,000, followed by Roscommon, at 110.8 and Dublin South City, at 99.4 per 100,000. Over half of first admissions to the Mercy Hospital, Cork (58%) and to Mayo General Hospital (57%) were for depressive disorders (Table 4.14).

Length of stay

Over one quarter of discharges from most units and hospitals occurred within one week of admission (Table 4.20, Table 4.21 and Table 4.22). There were some exceptions to this however. For example, 4% of discharges from St Finan's Hospital, Killarney, 6% from St Dymphna's, Carlow and 7% from the Central Mental Hospital occurred within one week of admission.

5. Counties – First Admissions

This section of the report presents rates of first admissions by a patient’s county of residence. It should be borne in mind that counties such as Dublin, Cork and Galway are served by more than one catchment area and service.

The analysis of first admissions by county was based on the 5,917 first admissions of Irish residents aged 16 years and over to psychiatric hospitals in 2005. A total of 38 non-residents were excluded from the analysis, as it was not possible to allocate them to a county of residence in Ireland.

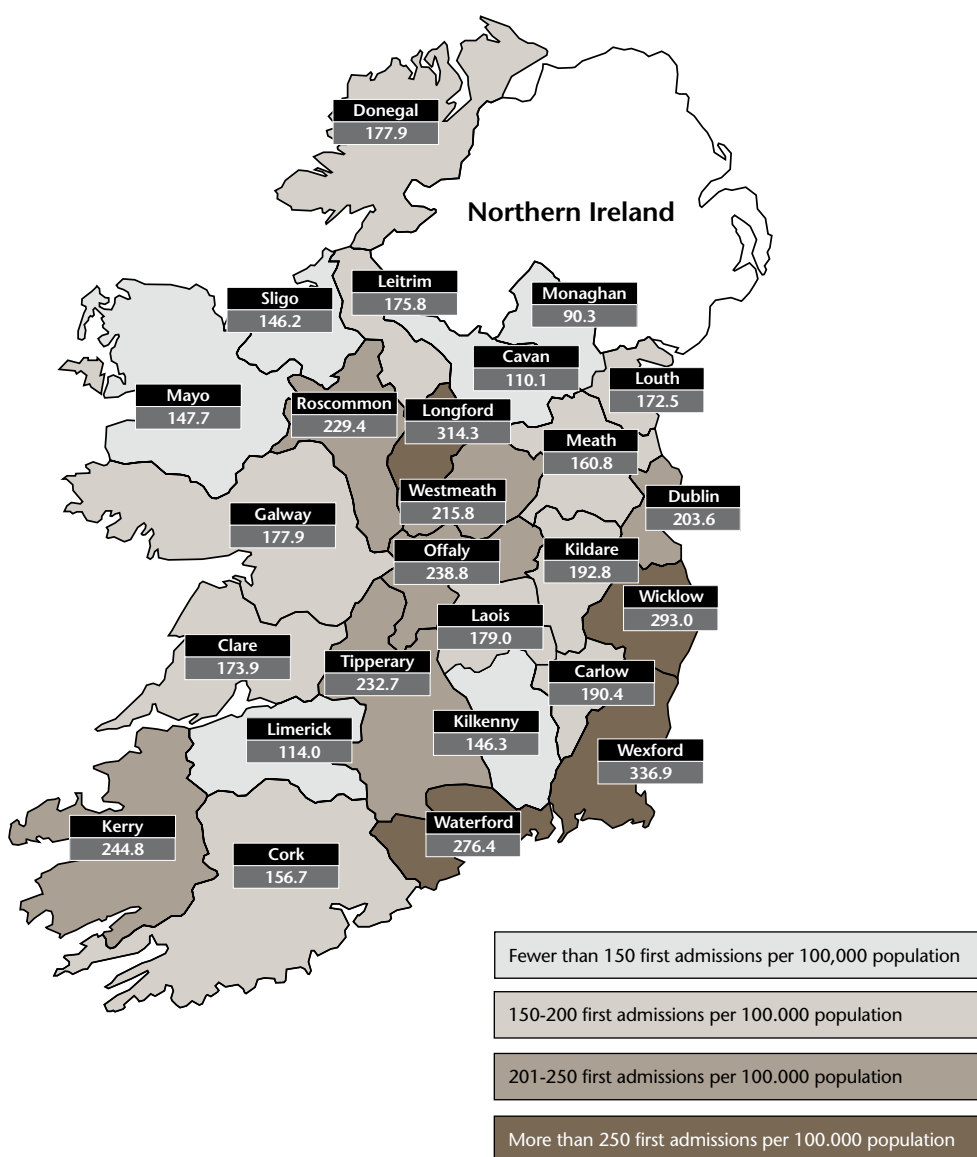


Figure 5.1 First admissions by county. Ireland 2005. Rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

The rate of first admissions in 2005 (5,917) was less than in 2004 (6,071). The highest rates of first admissions in 2005 were reported for counties Wexford (336.9 per 100,000 population), Longford (314.3) and Wicklow (293.0) (Figure 5.1, Table 5.1). The lowest rates were reported for counties Monaghan (90.3), Cavan (110.1) and Limerick (114.0).

First Admissions for selected diagnostic groups by county

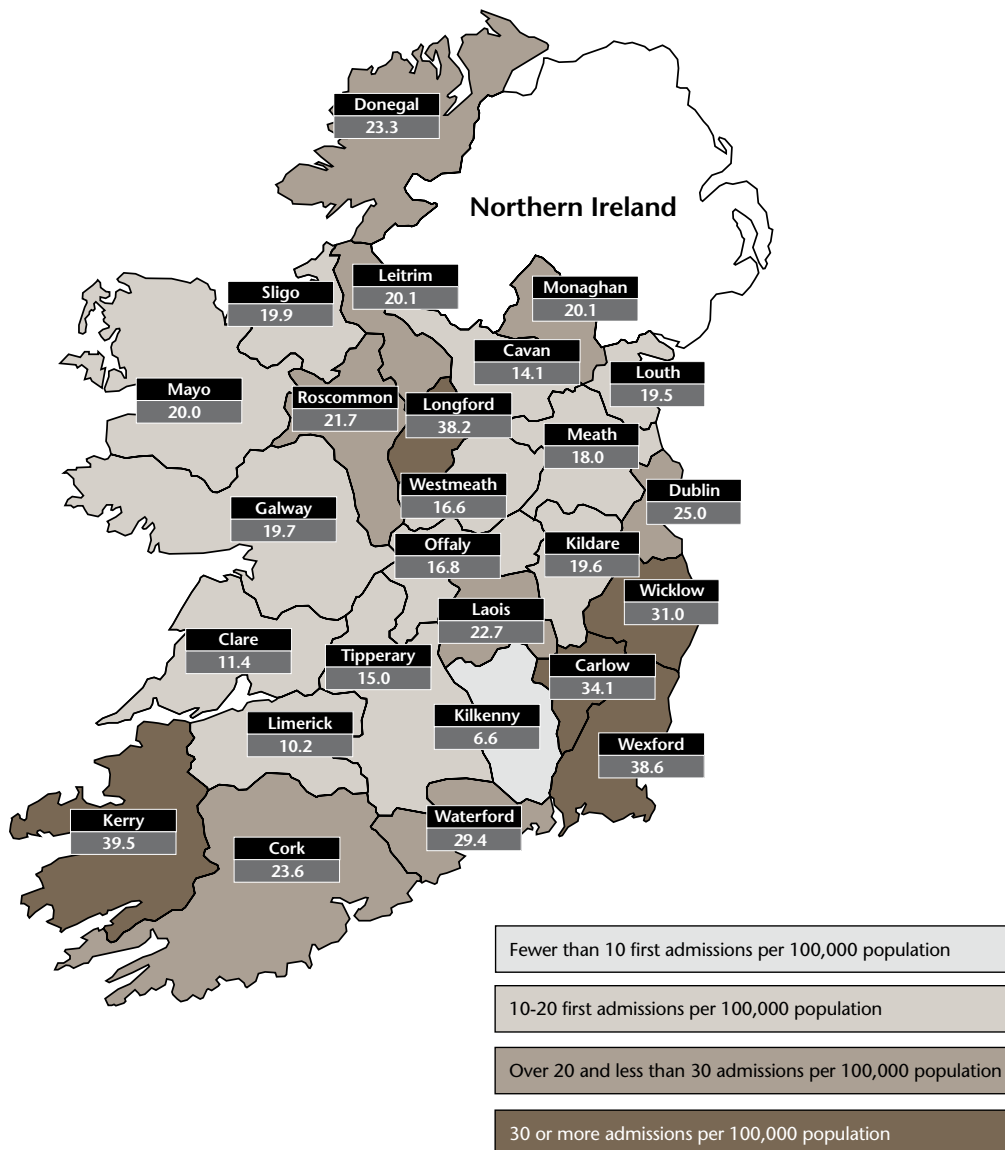


Figure 5.2 First admissions for schizophrenia by county. Ireland 2005. Rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

First admission rates for schizophrenia, depressive disorders and alcoholic disorders are presented in Table 5.1. The highest rates of first admissions for schizophrenia (more than 30 per 100,000 population) were reported for counties Kerry (39.5), Wexford (38.6) and Longford (38.2) (Figure 5.2, Table 5.1). The lowest rates were in Kilkenny (6.6 per 100,000 population) and Limerick (10.2).

There was in excess of a ten-fold difference in first admission rates for alcoholic disorders between the highest rate, Wicklow (87.3 per 100,000 population) and the lowest rate, Monaghan (7.5).

Compared to 2004, the 2005 rates of first admissions for schizophrenia increased the most in county Carlow, from 19.9 to 34.1 per 100,000 population. The rates of first admissions for schizophrenia per 100,000 decreased in a number of counties. The largest decreases were in counties Tipperary (31.8 to 15.0) and Laois (34.0 to 22.7).

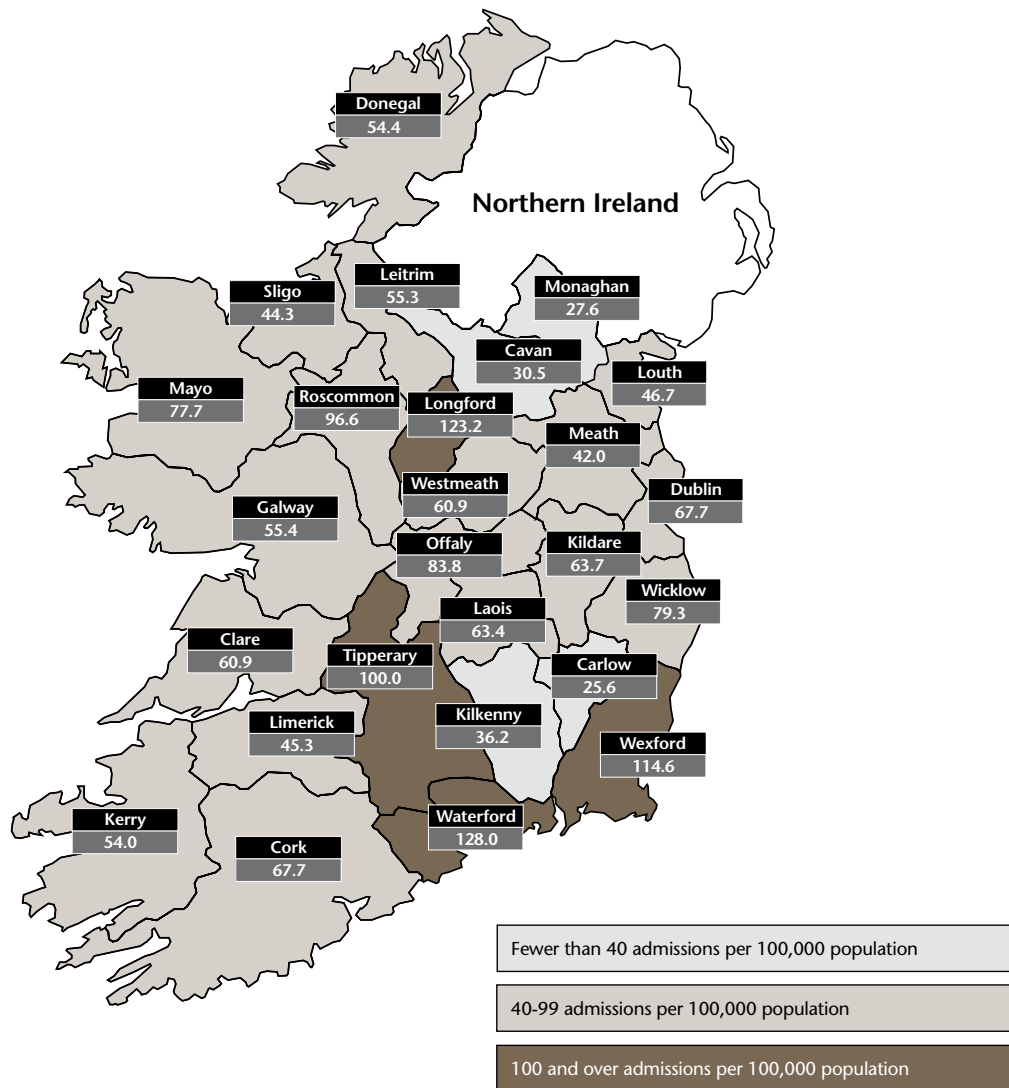


Figure 5.3 First admissions for depressive disorders by county. Ireland 2005. Rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

The rates of first admissions for depressive disorders are shown in Figure 5.3. Similar to 2004, the rates of first admissions for depressive disorders were higher than the rates of first admissions for schizophrenia, in all counties (Table 5.1). The highest rates were reported for counties Waterford (128.0 per 100,000 population), Longford (123.2) and Wexford (114.6). The lowest rates were reported for counties Carlow (25.6) and Monaghan (27.6) (Table 5.1, Figure 5.3).

Compared to the figures for 2004, the rates of first admissions for depressive disorders in 2005 increased the most in counties Leitrim (30.2 per 100,000 population) and Kildare (27.8). However, the rates of first admissions for depressive disorders per 100,000 population in 2005 decreased in a number of counties including Louth (72.6 in 2004 to 46.7 in 2005) and Monaghan (50.2 to 27.6).

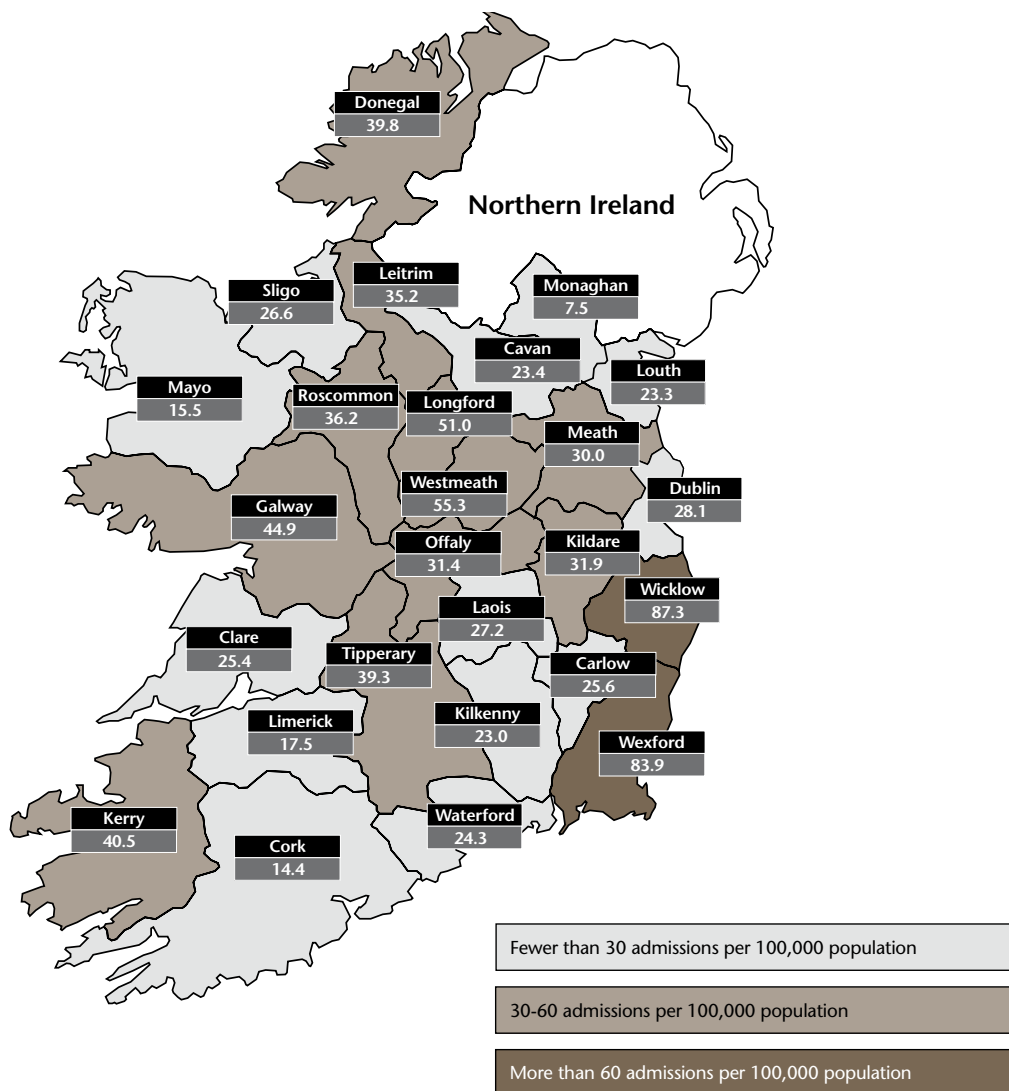


Figure 5.4 First admissions for alcoholic disorders by county, Ireland 2005. Rates per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over.

Finally, the rates of first admissions for alcoholic disorders are presented in Figure 5.4. The highest rates were reported for counties Wicklow (87.3 per 100,000 population) and Wexford (83.9). The lowest rates of first admissions for alcoholic disorders were reported for counties Monaghan (7.5 per 100,000 population) Cork (14.4), and Mayo (15.5) (Figure 5.4, Table 5.1).

As compared to the figures for 2004, there was an overall decrease in the rates of first admissions for alcoholic disorders. For example, the rates in County Louth fell from 41.5 per 100,000 population in 2004 to 23.3 per 100,000 population in 2005 and County Kerry fell from 54.0 in 2004 to 40.5 in 2005.

However, a number of counties did show increases in the rates of first admissions for alcoholic disorders between 2004 and 2005. For example, County Wexford showed an increase from a rate of 59.0 first admissions for alcoholic disorders per 100,000 population in 2004 to 83.9 first admissions for alcoholic disorders per 100,000 population in 2005. County Wicklow also showed an increase from 68.9 in 2004 to 87.3 in 2005.

6. Children's Centres

Data was returned for two children's centres in 2005: Warrenstown House in Dublin and St Anne's Children's Centre in Galway. There were 62 admissions to these children's centres in 2005, with 51 first admissions and 11 readmissions (Table 6.1).

Gender and age

Males accounted for 55% of admissions (Table 6.2). Two-thirds (66%) of admissions were aged 14-15 years, with a further 11% aged 16 years.¹

Diagnosis

Thirty-six per cent of admissions to children's centres had a diagnosis of depressive disorders, with eating disorders accounting for 16% and schizophrenia and neuroses each accounting for 11% of admissions (Table 6.3). Eighty-six per cent of those admitted with schizophrenia were male, as were 71% of those admitted with neuroses.
