

Who is it for?

- Young people under 18 years who are using alcohol and/or drugs and require support
- Contact with parents, guardians or social workers is requested

What do they do?

- Provides individual support to young people and their parents around a young person's drug use
- Medical and psychiatric assesment carried out
- Organises counselling and psychological support
- Helps young person to look at their drug use and the reasons they may be using
- Supports family to make necessary changes to help young person
- Works with school or other services to get young person back into education or training
- Deals with homelessness if that is an issue for the young person
- Professional consultation for schools and services

There are many centres around the country that offer Drug Detoxification, Treatment and Rehabilitation. Some of these centres are run by the HSE and some by Voluntary and Not-for-profit Organisations. The time you can spend in a drug detox and rehabilitation centre can vary from 6 weeks to 12 months depending on the type of programme offered by the centre. If you feel ready to enter a Detoxification and Rehabilitation programme or would just like more information about the options open to you, talk to your local drugs projects. Financial assistance through the Residential Options Fund can be discussed with a project worker.

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Suicide Advice

In the event that someone close to you attempts to take their own life, get immediate medical attention for them:

- Contact your local doctor
- Go to, or contact, the Accident and Emergency Department at St Jame's Hospital or Tallaght Hospital which are responsible for the D10 area

If you are worried that someone might be thinking of taking their own life or self-harming it is very important not to ignore the signals. Talking about suicide will NOT plant an idea in a vulnerable person's mind.

How to Respond:

- Show you care by being supportive, for example say something like:
 "I'm worried about you and I am here to help."
- If you are worried that someone is acutely suicidal find out by asking them if they have plans to harm themselves
- Get help or encourage them to get help, for example by saying "I will stay with you until you can get help"

Essential Information

Finding a Used Syringe

If you find a used syringe in a public place or in your garden please do not ignore it and presume someone else will deal with it.

Dublin City Council is responsible for disposing of hazardous waste. Ring the following numbers and someone will come out and dispose of the syringe:

Drug Overdose

A drug overdose is a very serious situation and the person overdosing requires IMMEDIATE MEDICAL HELP.

If somebody overdoses ring 999 immediately and ask for an ambulance.

If you know what drug/s the person has taken tell the ambulance crew. This information could save their life.

Place the person in the emergency position so that they cannot choke on their own vomit.

If they stop breathing perform CPR (see diagram opposite).

The priority of the emergency services is to help the person who has overdosed and not to try and find out who else has been using illegal drugs.


CPR



CALL - Check the victim for unresponsiveness. If there is no response, Call 999 and return to the victim. In most locations the emergency dispatcher can assist you with CPR instructions.



BLOW - Tilt the head back and listen for breathing. If not breathing normally, pinch nose and cover the mouth with yours and blow until you see the chest rise. Give 2 breaths. Each breath should take 1 second.



PUMP - If the victim is still not breathing normally, coughing or moving, begin chest compressions. Push down on the chest 1.5 to 2 inches 30 times right between the nipples. Pump at the rate of 100/minute, faster than once per second.

CONTINUE WITH 2 BREATHS AND 15 PUMPS UNTIL HELP ARRIVES

NOTE - This ratio is the same for one-person & two-person CPR. In two-person CPR the person pumping the chest stops while the other gives mouth-to-mouth breathing.
