
Role of the Co-ordinator

The role of the Co-ordinator is to co-ordinate the planning and evaluation of services for persons involved with drug and alcohol misuse whether provided by the H.S.E or the voluntary sector and to liaise closely with all service providers. The Co-ordinator does not provide any treatment of Drug and Alcohol misuse directly to the public but is involved in:

- · Determining needs within the community
- Developing recommendations and services in the prevention and treatment of drug and alcohol misuse

Currently treatment services are established in Co. Kerry, West Cork, North and East Cork and additional services in Cork City at Arbour House and a North City location.

As the Co-ordinator does not provide services directly to the public there is no access arrangement. However, considerable contact is maintained through liaison work with voluntary groups, the Local Drugs Task Force and the Southern Regional Drugs Task Force.
