




Figure 1: Percentage change between Q3 2009 and Q3 2010 for selected offence groups



Recorded Crime

Quarter 3 2010

Dangerous and Negligent Acts down almost a fifth

When comparing Quarter 3 2010 (Q3 2010) with Quarter 3 2009, Group 04 *Dangerous or Negligent Acts* offences fell by 19.4%. Falls were also observed in other groups, including Group 07 *Burglary and Related Offences* (-16.6%), Group 10 *Controlled Drug Offences* (-11.0%) and Group 03 *Attempts or Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences* (-10.1%). Group 06 *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* rose by 21.2% while Group 09 *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* increased slightly (+1.0%). See figure 1.

When comparing the 12-month period ending in Q3 2010 with that ending in Q3 2009, Group 06 *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* rose by 25.0%, while recorded Group 12 *Damage to Property and to the Environment* decreased by 9.3%, and Group 04 *Dangerous or Negligent Acts* offences decreased by over a quarter (-25.8%).

The rise in the number of recorded Sexual Offences in the first nine months of 2010 is mainly due to an on-going review of all cases involving alleged sexual offences reported to An Garda Síochána. Some of these offences will have occurred at some distance in the past but are represented on the date of reclassification. This review is being undertaken in conjunction with the Garda Síochána policy on the investigation of sexual crime, which was introduced in April 2010. Please see the Background Notes for further information on crime recording.

Group 01 - Homicides

There were 11 recorded *Murder* offences in Q3 2010, representing a decrease of 1 (-8.3%) on the same quarter in 2009. For the 12-month period ending in Q3 2010, there was also a decrease (-13.3%) in the number of these offences, from 60 to 52, when compared with the same period ending in Q3 2009.

Group 02 - Sexual Offences

The number of recorded offences in this group increased (+79.6%) from 338 in Q3 2009 to 607 in Q3 2010. Also, when considering the 12-month period ending in Q3 2010, there was an increase of over a half (+54.1%) when compared with the previous 12 months. In this time period *Sexual assault (not aggravated)* offences rose from 877 to 1,483, an increase of almost 70%. However, as noted above, caution should be used in interpreting these increases.

Group 03 - Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences

The number of *Harassment and related offences* decreased by over 12% from 635 in Q3 2009 to 558 in Q3 2010. The largest number of offences in this group was recorded under *Other assault*, which fell from 11,977 in the 12-month period ending in September 2009 to 11,018 in the 12-months ending in September 2010.

Group 04 - Dangerous or Negligent Acts

In Q3 2010, recorded *Dangerous or Negligent Acts* offences decreased by almost twenty percent (-19.4%) to 3,000 when compared with Q3 2009. This decrease mainly relates to *Driving/In charge of a vehicle while over legal alcohol limit* offences, which decreased from 3,288 (Q3 2009) to 2,776 (Q3 2010), a decrease of 15.6%.



Group 05 - Kidnapping and Related Offences

There was a decrease of 16 (-39.0%) offences in this group between Q3 2009 and Q3 2010. *False imprisonment* offences fell from 21 to 15 in this time period. *Human trafficking* offences decreased to 30 in the 12-month period ending in September 2010, from 46 in the 12-month period ending in September 2009.

Group 06 - Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences

The quarterly figure for *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* rose by over a fifth (+21.2%), from 589 in Q3 2009 to 714 in Q3 2010. There were 1,783 recorded offences of *Robbery from the person* in the 12-month period ending in September 2010, a rise of 45.3% on the corresponding period ending in September 2009.

Group 07 - Burglary and Related Offences

In Q3 2010, there were 6,016 recorded *Burglary and related offences* representing a decrease of 1,194 (-16.6%) on the number recorded in Q3 2009. However the annualised total for these offences, up to end of Q3 2010, saw a smaller percentage decrease of 2.9% over the 12 month period to end of Q3 2009. *Aggravated burglary* offences decreased by 37 (-10.1%) in this 12-month period. The annualised totals for *Burglary and related Offences* are shown in figure 3.

Group 08 - Theft and Related Offences

Theft and Related Offences decreased slightly (-0.5%) between Q3 2009 and Q3 2010. *Theft/taking of vehicle and related offences* decreased by over 14% from 3,252 to 2,787 between these two quarters. The annualised figure for *Theft/taking of vehicle and related offences* decreased by 2,155 (-15.8%) from 13,666 to 11,511 in the 12-month period prior to the end of Q3 2010.

Group 09 - Fraud, Deception and Related Offences

There were 1,189 recorded *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* in Q3 2010. This was an increase of 12 (+1.0%) on the same period in Q3 2009. In the 12-month period ending in Q3 2010, *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* decreased by 4.8% when compared with the corresponding period ending in Q3 2009, from 5,095 to 4,851.

Group 10 - Controlled Drug Offences

In Q3 2010, there were 5,326 recorded *Controlled Drug Offences*, a decrease of 11.0% on the Q3 2009 total. *Cultivation or manufacture of drugs* offences more than doubled from 80 to 191 between Q3 2009 and Q3 2010. There were 3,807 recorded offences of *Possession of drugs for personal use* offences in Q3 2010, a decrease of 17.4% on the corresponding figure in Q3 2009.

Group 11 - Weapons and Explosives Offences

There were 936 offences in Group 11 *Weapons and Explosives Offences*, in Q3 2010, a decrease of 8.2% on Q3 2009. *Offensive weapons offences (nec)* fell from 811 in Q3 2009 to 755 in Q3 2010, a decrease of almost 7%. The number of *Fireworks offences* rose from 302 for the twelve-month period ending in Q3 2009 to 416 for the same period ending in Q3 2010, an increase of 37.7%.

Group 12 - Damage to Property and to the Environment

Recorded *Arson* offences decreased by over 20% from 811 in Q3 2009 to 642 in Q3 2010. The largest number of offences recorded in this group was for *Criminal damage (not arson)*. These offences decreased by 7.4% from 9,787 in Q3 2009 to 9,063 in Q3 2010.


Group 13 - Public Order and other Social Code Offences

Recorded *Liquor licencing* offences fell by 16.3% from 815 in Q3 2009 to 682 in Q3 2010. The most frequently occurring offences in Group 13 were under *Disorderly conduct*, which fell from 12,741 in Q3 2009 to 12,530 in Q3 2010. This is equivalent to approximately 139 *Disorderly conduct* offences a day in Q3 2010.

Group 15 - Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime

There were 2,072 *Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime* recorded in Q3 2010, a decrease of almost 27% when compared with the same period in 2009.

Background Notes

Introduction The Crime Incidents, Quarter 3, 2010 release provides provisional figures for the number of offences recorded by An Garda Síochána, based on the Irish Crime Classification System (ICCS) but excluding elements of Group 4 (*Dangerous or Negligent Acts*), and all of Groups 14 (*Road and Traffic Offences (Not Elsewhere Classified or nec)*) and 16 (*Offences Not Elsewhere Classified*). Figures are provided from Quarter 1, 2007 to Quarter 3, 2010. The information supplied in this report refers only to crime incidents known to An Garda Síochána and recorded as such in the Garda PULSE (Police Using Leading Systems Effectively) system. Because of timing issues with respect to the extraction of data, figures may be revised subsequent to this publication.

Crime recording Incidents reported or which become known to members of An Garda Síochána are recorded when, on the balance of probability, a Garda determines that a criminal offence defined by law has taken place, and there is no credible evidence to the contrary. If it is subsequently determined that a criminal offence did not take place, the criminal offence recorded is invalidated and is not counted in the statistics. If a person makes a report and subsequently withdraws it by stating that the criminal act did not take place, then this too is invalidated unless there is evidence to suggest that, by reasonable probability, the offence has taken place.

For criminal offences where victim confirmation is required (e.g. assault, fraud), a criminal offence is recorded only where the victim confirms the offence or where there is evidence to suggest that by reasonable probability it occurred. Another important feature of a recorded offence is that it is based on the date reported to, or that it became known to, the Gardaí. This has major implications for some offence types. Notable amongst these are sexual offences, as it has often been the case that such incidents have been reported to An Garda Síochána many years (sometimes decades) after the event(s). Thus a sexual assault, which occurred in 1960, would be included in the statistics for 2008 if it was first reported in that year.

Crime classification A criminal offence is classified as a particular offence type at the initial recording of that offence. However, upon investigation, it may later become apparent that an alternative offence type should be used. In this event, the record is amended to reflect this. Re-classification on the basis of court proceedings only occurs in relation to homicide offences. A murder offence is reclassified as manslaughter when a charge of manslaughter commences or when a murder charge results in a conviction for manslaughter. It is also possible, though more rare, that an incident originally classified as manslaughter may be re-classified as murder. Also, a re-classification to a homicide offence occurs when, for example, a serious assault has been recorded and, some time later, the victim dies as a consequence of the assault.

General counting rules Crime counting rules are applied to all criminal offences for the purposes of the statistics. The following are the main rules relevant to the quarterly figures:

Primary Offence Rule: Where two or more criminal offences are disclosed in a single episode, it is the primary criminal offence that is counted. The primary offence is that offence which the greater penalty may apply. Where offences have similar penalties, offences against the person take precedence over offences against property for the purpose of determining the primary offence.

One Offence Counts Per Victim: One offence counts per victim involved with the exceptions of cheque/credit card fraud and burglary. Under certain circumstances, the cheque/credit card exception necessitates that a series of these offences counts as one crime where the originating bank ultimately suffers the loss. The burglary exception dictates that one burglary offence is counted where property belonging to two or more victims is stolen (or damaged) during a single burglary.

Continuous Series Involving the Same Victim and Same Offender: A continuous series of offences against the same victim involving the same offender counts as one offence.
