

#### Robberies up over 35%

When comparing Quarter 4 of 2010 (Q4 2010) with Quarter 4 of 2009, Group 06 *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* rose by 36.2%. Smaller increases were also observed in Group 11 *Weapons and Explosives Offences* (+6.9%) and Group 09 Fraud, Deception and Related Offences (+3.3%).

Group 04 Dangerous or Negligent Acts offences fell by 18.0%. Falls were also observed in other groups, including Group 03 Attempts or Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences (-10.7%) and Group 10 Controlled *Drug Offences* (-9.6%). *See table 1.1 and figure 1.* 

When comparing annual totals for 2010 with 2009, Group 06 Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences rose by 28.2%, while recorded Group 04 Dangerous or Negligent Acts offences decreased by over a fifth (-22.3%) and Group 12 Damage to Property and to the Environment decreased by 7.4%. See table 1.2 and figure 4.

The rise in the number of recorded Sexual Offences in 2010 is mainly due to an on-going review of all cases involving alleged sexual offences reported to An Garda Síochána. Some of these offences will have occurred at some distance in the past but are represented on the date of reclassification. This review is being undertaken in conjunction with the Garda Síochána policy on the investigation of sexual crime, which was introduced in April 2010. Figure 2: Annualised total homicide offences, Q4 2008 to Q4 2010





Figure 3: Annualised total burglary and related offences, Q4 2008 to Q4 2010



#### **Group 01 - Homicides**

There were 15 recorded *Murder* offences in Q4 2010, representing an increase of 2 on the same quarter in 2009. For 2010, there was a decrease of 2 in the annual total of these offences, from 56 to 54 in 2010.

#### **Group 02 - Sexual Offences**

The number of recorded offences in this group increased (+23.2%) from 315 in Q4 2009 to 388 in Q4 2010. Also, in 2010, there was an increase of over three-fifths (+60.3%) when compared with the previous year. Also in 2010, *Sexual assault (not aggravated)* offences rose from 895 to 1,547, an increase of over 70%. However, as noted above, caution should be used in interpreting these increases.

# Group 03 - Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences

The number of *Attempts or Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassment and Related offences* decreased by over 10% from 4,319 in Q4 2009 to 3,858 in Q4 2010. Almost two thirds of Group 03 offences were recorded under *Other assault,* which fell from 11,847 in 2009 to 11,017 in 2010.

#### **Group 04 - Dangerous or Negligent Acts**

In Q4 2010, recorded *Dangerous or Negligent Acts* offences decreased by 18% to 2,725 when compared with Q4 2009. Over 90% of offences in this group relate to *Driving/In charge of a vehicle while over legal alcohol limit* offences, which decreased from 2,979 (Q4 2009) to 2,479 (Q4 2010), a decrease of 16.8%.

#### **Group 05 - Kidnapping and Related Offences**

There was a decrease of just over 10% in offences in this group between 2009 and 2010, from 146 to 131. Most of this decrease was in *Human trafficking offences* which decreased from 49 to 29 between 2009 and 2010.

#### Group 06 - Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences

The quarterly figure for *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* rose by over a third (+36.2%), from 649 in Q4 2009 to 884 in Q4 2010. There were 1,942 recorded offences of *Robbery from the person* in 2010, a rise of 48.2% from 2009.

#### **Group 07 - Burglary and Related Offences**

In Q4 2010, there were 6,920 recorded *Burglary and related offences* representing a decrease of 184 (-2.6%) on the number recorded in Q4 2009. Over 95% of offences in this category were *Burglary (not aggravated)* offences. *Aggravated burglary* offences decreased by 35 (-9.5%) from 2009 to 2010. The annualised totals for *Burglary and related Offences* are shown in *figure 3*.

#### **Group 08 - Theft and Related Offences**

Theft and Related Offences decreased slightly (-0.3%) between Q4 2009 and Q4 2010. The annual total for *Theft/taking of vehicle and related offences* decreased by almost 14% between 2009 (13,130) and 2010 (11,367).

#### **Group 09 - Fraud, Deception and Related Offences**

There were 1,145 recorded *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* in Q4 2010. This was an increase of 37 (+3.3%) on the same period in Q4 2009. In 2010, *Fraud, Deception and Related Offences* increased slightly by 0.4% when compared with 2009, from 4,947 to 4,965.


#### **Group 10 - Controlled Drug Offences**

In Q4 2010, there were 4,146 recorded *Controlled Drug Offences*, a decrease of 9.6% on the Q4 2009 total. *Cultivation or manufacture of drugs* offences more than doubled from 75 to 151 between Q4 2009 and Q4 2010. There were 2,891 recorded *Possession of drugs for personal use* offences in Q4 2010, a decrease of 15.0% on the corresponding figure in Q4 2009.

#### **Group 11 - Weapons and Explosives Offences**

There were 1,225 recorded Group 11 Weapons and Explosives Offences, in Q4 2010, an increase of 6.9% on Q4 2009. The majority of these offences were Offensive weapons offences (nec), which rose from 650 in Q4 2009 to 698 in Q4 2010, an increase of over 7%. The number of Possession of a firearm offences recorded rose from 106, in Q4 2009, to 128 in Q4 2010, an increase of 20.8%.

#### **Group 12 - Damage to Property and to the Environment**

Recorded *Arson* offences increased by almost 4% from 681 in Q4 2009 to 707 in Q4 2010. Over 90% of offences recorded in this group were *Criminal damage (not arson)*. These offences decreased by 1.3% from 9,162 in Q4 2009 to 9,041 in Q4 2010.

#### **Group 13 - Public Order and other Social Code Offences**

Recorded *Liquor licencing offences* fell by over 25% from 813 in Q4 2009 to 605 in Q4 2010. The most frequently occurring offences in Group 13 were under *Disorderly conduct*, which fell from 11,951 in Q4 2009 to 11,535 in Q4 2010. This is equivalent to approximately 128 *Disorderly conduct* offences a day in Q4 2010.

# **Group 15 - Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime**

There were 2,040 Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime recorded in Q4 2010, a decrease of almost 23% when compared with the same period in 2009.

## **Background Notes**

#### Introduction

The Crime Incidents, Quarter 4, 2010 release provides provisional figures for the number of offences recorded by An Garda Síochána, based on the Irish Crime Classification System (ICCS) but excluding elements of Group 4 (*Dangerous or Negligent Acts*), and all of Groups 14 (*Road and Traffic Offences (Not Elsewhere Classified or nec*)) and 16 (*Offences Not Elsewhere Classified*). Figures are provided from Quarter 1, 2007 to Quarter 4, 2010. The information supplied in this report refers only to crime incidents known to An Garda Síochána and recorded as such in the Garda PULSE (Police Using Leading Systems Effectively) system. Because of timing issues with respect to the extraction of data, figures may be revised subsequent to this publication.

#### Crime recording

Incidents reported or which become known to members of An Garda Síochána are recorded when, on the balance of probability, a Garda determines that a criminal offence defined by law has taken place, and there is no credible evidence to the contrary. If it is subsequently determined that a criminal offence did not take place, the criminal offence recorded is invalidated and is not counted in the statistics. If a person makes a report and subsequently withdraws it by stating that the criminal act did not take place, then this too is invalidated unless there is evidence to suggest that, by reasonable probability, the offence has taken place.

For criminal offences where victim confirmation is required (e.g. assault, fraud), a criminal offence is recorded only where the victim confirms the offence or where there is evidence to suggest that by reasonable probability it occurred. Another important feature of a recorded offence is that it is based on the date reported to, or that it became known to, the Gardaí. This has major implications for some offence types. Notable amongst these are sexual offences, as it has often been the case that such incidents have been reported to An Garda Síochána many years (sometimes decades) after the event(s). Thus a sexual assault, which occurred in 1960, would be included in the statistics for 2008 if it was first reported in that year.

#### Crime classification

A criminal offence is classified as a particular offence type at the initial recording of that offence. However, upon investigation, it may later become apparent that an alternative offence type should be used. In this event, the record is amended to reflect this. Re-classification on the basis of court proceedings only occurs in relation to homicide offences. A murder offence is reclassified as manslaughter when a charge of manslaughter commences or when a murder charge results in a conviction for manslaughter. It is also possible, though more rare, that an incident originally classified as manslaughter may be re-classified as murder. Also, a re-classification to a homicide offence occurs when, for example, a serious assault has been recorded and, some time later, the victim dies as a consequence of the assault.

#### General counting rules

Crime counting rules are applied to all criminal offences for the purposes of the statistics. The following are the main rules relevant to the quarterly figures:

**Primary Offence Rule:** Where two or more criminal offences are disclosed in a single episode, it is the primary criminal offence that is counted. The primary offence is that offence which the greater penalty may apply. Where offences have similar penalties, offences against the person take precedence over offences against property for the purpose of determining the primary offence.

One Offence Counts Per Victim: One offence counts per victim involved with the exceptions of cheque/credit card fraud and burglary. Under certain circumstances, the cheque/credit card exception necessitates that a series of these offences counts as one crime where the originating bank ultimately suffers the loss. The burglary exception dictates that one burglary offence is counted where property belonging to two or more victims is stolen (or damaged) during a single burglary.

Continuous Series Involving the Same Victim and Same Offender: A continuous series of offences against the same victim involving the same offender counts as one offence.
