## PQ 40009/14

To ask the Minister for Health the number of persons in receipt of methadone as opioid substitute treatment in the years 2012, 2013 and to date in 2014; and the cost to the Exchequer of providing this treatment for each of those years.

Dear Deputy Broughan,

The Health Service Executive has been requested to reply directly to you in the context of the above Parliamentary Question, which you submitted to the Minister for Health for response. I have examined the matter and the following outlines the position.

According to information provided by the HSE's Central Treatment List, as of the end of September 2014 there were a total of 9,301 patients receiving Methadone treatment, 9,116 patients as of the end of December 2013 and 8923 patients as of the end of December 2012. These figures do not include patients receiving methadone maintenance within the Prison system.

Of the total expenditure attributed to Addiction Services within Social Inclusion it is not possible to identify all of the elements of the funding specifically for Opioid substitution treatment. However, costs attributed to The Methadone Treatment Scheme (excluding the funding or operation of Treatment Clinics) are set out in the below table:

Note: The total cost of the Methadone Treatment Scheme during the period 2012 to August 2014 comprises:

- 1. Pharmacy Ingredient cost and the associated dispensing fees
- 2. GPs Fees paid to GPs contracted to the General Medical Services (GMS) Scheme who are registered to provide services to clients approved under the Methadone Treatment Scheme.
