Activities of Irish Psychiatric Units and Hospitals 2014

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About the HRB

The **NPIRS Team** gathers data on patient admissions and discharges from psychiatric hospitals and units throughout Ireland. The data collected have been reported in the *Activities of Irish Psychiatric Services* since 1965 and continue to play a central role in the planning of service delivery. These findings inform national policy, health service management, clinical practice and international academic research in the area of mental health.



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Glossary

Approved centre. An approved centre is an in-patient facility approved for the reception and treatment of patients by the Mental Health Commission.

Central Mental Hospital. The Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum, is administered by HSE Dublin Mid-Leinster but serves the country as a whole rather than a specified catchment area.

Community Healthcare Organisations (CHOs). The HSE published the report *Community Healthcare Organisations – Report and Recommendations of the Integrated Service Area Review Group* in October 2014 and this provided a framework for new governance and organisational structures for community health care services. Central to the report was the establishment of nine Community Healthcare Organisations to deliver an integrated model of care that would see the Integrated Service Area (ISA) structure develop into the Community Health Organisation (CHO) in 2015. The population breakdown for each area is outlined in Appendix 2 and the composition of each area in terms of approved centres and catchment areas is presented in Appendix 4.

Health Research Board (HRB). The Health Research Board (HRB) was established in 1986 (under Statutory Instrument No. 279) to promote, assist, commission and conduct medical, health, epidemiological and health services research in Ireland. The board arose from the amalgamation of two former bodies, the Medical Research Council and the Medico-Social Research Board (MSRB).

Health Service Executive (HSE) Areas. The address from which each patient was admitted to hospital is used to allocate the patient to the corresponding Health Service Executive (HSE) area and the admission is rated accordingly. Thus, tabulations relating to HSE areas are calculated irrespective of whether or not the patient is admitted to a hospital administered by that area. Data on patients admitted to independent/private and private charitable centres are returned to the area in which they normally reside. A map outlining each HSE area and its respective catchment population according to the Census of Population 2012 (Central Statistics Office, www.cso.ie) is presented in Chapter 1.

ICD-10. The diagnostic groups in this report are based on the World Health Organization's (WHO) International Classification of Diseases categories (ICD-10) (WHO 1992).

Independent/private and private charitable centres. This term replaces the previously used term 'private hospitals'.



In-patient days. In-patient days are the number of days spent in hospital from date of admission to date of discharge. They are calculated by subtracting date of admission from date of discharge, including time spent on transfer for medical or surgical purposes while still 'on the books' of psychiatric units and hospitals.

Legal status. The legal status reported throughout this report is that recorded on admission. Changes may occur in legal status following admission but this is not recorded by the NPIRS.

Length of stay. Length of stay is derived by calculating the amount of time spent in hospital between admission and discharge by subtracting date of admission from date of discharge, including time spent on transfer for medical or surgical purposes while still 'on the books' of psychiatric units and hospitals. It should be remembered that because of existing legislative provisions, a small number of involuntary patients may be absent on leave but remain 'on the books' until formally discharged later.

Long-stay patient. A long-stay patient is one who has been in hospital continuously for one year or more.

New long-stay patient. A new long-stay patient is one who has been in hospital continuously for one year to five years.

Old long-stay patient. An old long-stay patient is one who has been in hospital continuously for five years or more.

Residents. Resident patients are all patients in hospital ('on the books') on census night.

Socio-economic group. The occupation of a patient is allocated to one of 11 socio-economic groups according to the Classification of Occupations of the Central Statistics Office (CSO) in the Census of Population 2012 (Central Statistics Office, www.cso.ie). Socio-economic group is determined by a person's occupation or their former occupation where the patient is unemployed or retired. If a patient is a student or engaged in house duties, the occupation of the head of household or spouse or guardian is used to determine socio-economic group. If such persons (students and/or persons engaged in house duties) are not members of a family unit and/or are living alone (e.g. widowed grandparents), they are assigned to the unknown group.

Executive summary

National admissions

There were 17,797 admissions to Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2014, a rate of 387.9 per 100,000 total population. This is a decrease of 660 admissions from 2013 (18,457) and also a decrease in the rate of admissions from 402.3 in 2013 to 387.9 in 2014. First admission numbers decreased by 113, from 6,055 in 2013 to 5,942 in 2014, while the rate of first admissions similarly decreased from 132.0 in 2013 to 129.5 in 2014. Re-admissions declined from 12,402 in 2013 to 11,855 in 2014, with the proportion of admissions that were re-admissions remaining the same at 67%. The rate of re-admissions decreased from 270.3 in 2013 to 258.4 in 2014. Approved centres reported an additional ten persons presenting for admission in 2014 for whom admission was not deemed appropriate and were therefore not admitted.

There was an equal proportion of male and female admissions, with rates being almost equal, at 388.7 per 100,000 for males and 387.1 for females. In contrast, males accounted for a higher proportion of first admissions, at 55% and similarly had a higher rate of first admissions, at 143.9 compared with 115.4 for females.

The 45–54 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions, at 570.4 per 100,000, followed by the 55–64 year age group, at 548.0, and the 20–24 year age group, at 544.0. The 75 year and over age group had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 432.0 per 100,000. The 18–19 year age group had the highest rate of first admissions, at 262.5 per 100,000 population, followed by the 20–24 year age group, at 240.9 and the 75 year and over age group, at 196.9. The 55–64 year age group had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 140.7 per 100,000. The mean age at admission was 44.83 (median 43; youngest age 13 and oldest age 98).

Single persons accounted for 57% of all and 53% of first admissions. Married persons accounted for 26% of all admissions, widowed accounted for 4% and divorced also accounted for 4%. Divorced persons had the highest rate of all admissions, at 744.0 per 100,000 despite accounting for just 4% of all admissions. Married persons had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 267.3. Divorced persons had the highest rate of first admissions, at 206.2, while married persons had the lowest rate, at 99.6 per 100,000.

The unskilled occupational group had the highest rate of all (670.0) and first admissions (181.6) in keeping with the trends in previous years but as noted in previous years, caution must be exercised when interpreting socio-economic group as 50% of occupations were returned as unknown or unspecified, making assignment to a socio-economic group impossible. Semi-skilled had the second-highest rate of all admissions, at 284.4 per 100,000. Forty-one per cent of all admissions in 2014



were returned as unemployed, 27% as employed, 9% as retired, 6% as students, 5% as engaged in house duties, while 12% were returned as unknown.

There were 253 admissions with no fixed abode in 2014. Sixty-seven per cent of these were male, 77% were single, 25% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 19% had a diagnosis of other drug disorders and 12% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders. Almost 85% of all admissions in 2014 were returned as 'White Irish', 6% were returned as 'Any Other White Background' (including 'White Irish Traveller', 'White Roma' and 'Any Other White Background') and 2% were distributed amongst various other ethnic groups. Eight per cent were returned as 'Unknown/unspecified'.

Depressive disorders were the most common diagnoses recorded for all admissions, accounting for 27% of all and 29% of first admissions and 26% of re-admissions, and accounted for the highest rates of all and first admissions, at 105.3 per 100,000 for all and 37.4 for first admissions. Schizophrenia accounted for 20% of all, 15% of first and almost 23% of re-admissions and had the second-highest rate of all and first admissions, at 77.2 per 100,000 for all and 18.9 for first.

Twelve per cent (11.6%) of all and 13% of first admissions were involuntary. This is a marginal increase from 11% of all and 12% of first admissions in 2013. The rate of involuntary all admissions increased from 44.4 per 100,000 in 2013 to 45.0 in 2014, while that for first admissions also increased from 15.7 in 2013 to 17.1 in 2014. All admissions for schizophrenia had the highest rate of involuntary admission, at 18.9 per 100,000, followed by mania, at 8.7 and depressive disorders, at 4.5.

National discharges and deaths

There were 17,643 discharges and 142 deaths in Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2014. Males accounted for 62% of all deaths in 2014, and 80% of those who died were aged 65 years and over. Ninety-two per cent of all those admitted in 2014 were discharged in 2014.

Almost one-third (30%) of all discharges in 2014 took place within one week of admission, 18% occurred within two weeks, 19% occurred within two to four weeks and 27% occurred within one to three months. Ninety-four per cent of all discharges occurred within three months of admission.

Just over half (51%) of all discharges with a diagnosis of other drug disorders, almost half of those with personality disorders (49.5%) and 41% of those with intellectual disability were discharged within one week of admission. Over 90% of discharges for most disorders occurred within three months of admission with the exception of organic mental disorders (76%), intellectual disability (80.5%) and development disorders (80.8%).

Average length of stay for all discharges was longest for discharges with intellectual disability (128 discharges), at 1,162.6 days (median 10 days), accounting for less than one per cent of all discharges and 12% of all in-patient days. Discharges with a diagnosis of organic mental disorders had the second-longest average length of stay, at 202.8 days (median 31 days), accounting for 3% of all discharges and 9.5% of all in-patient days.

Discharges with a primary discharge diagnosis of organic mental disorders had the longest average length of stay, excluding discharges with a length of stay of one year or more (239 discharges), at 48.5 days (median 24 days), followed by eating disorders, at 39.6 days (median 27 days) and schizophrenia, at 34.5 days (median 20 days). Discharges with a diagnosis of behavioural and emotional disorders of childhood and adolescence had the shortest average length of stay, at 10.7 days (median 5 days).

HSE Areas

Almost 30% of all admissions in 2014 were resident in Dublin Mid-Leinster, 22% were resident in Dublin North-East, almost 25% were resident in HSE South and 24% were resident in HSE West. Less than one per cent (55 admissions) of all admissions was recorded as non-resident on admission. HSE West had the highest rate of all admissions, at 392.6 per 100,000, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 388.5, HSE South, at 386.0 and Dublin North-East, at 378.7. HSE South had the highest rate of first admissions, at 134.0 per 100,000, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 129.9, HSE West, at 127.5 and Dublin North-East, at 122.0.

The proportion of re-admissions was similar in all HSE areas, ranging from 68% in Dublin North-East to 65% in HSE South. HSE West had the highest rate of re-admissions, at 265.1 per 100,000, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 258.7, Dublin North-East, at 256.6 and HSE South, at 252.1.

Females had higher rates of all admissions than males in Dublin Mid-Leinster (405.8 for females and 370.6 for males), Dublin North-East (385.3 for females and 371.8 for males) and in HSE West (397.4 for females and 387.8 for males). Males had higher rates of all admissions in HSE South, at 419.4 per 100,000, compared with 353.0 for females. Males had higher rates of first admissions than females in all areas with rates ranging from 161.5 per 100,000 in HSE South to 130.2 in Dublin North-East.

The 55–64 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions in Dublin Mid-Leinster and in Dublin North-East, at 603.5 and 578.5 per 100,000 respectively. The 20–24 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions in HSE South, at 636.3, while the 35–44 year age group had the highest rate in HSE West, at 581.5.



The 75 year and over age group had the highest rate of first admissions in Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 253.0 per 100,000, while the 18–19 year age group had the highest rate in both Dublin North-East and HSE South with rates of 234.3 and 279.3 respectively. The 20–24 year age group had the highest rate of first admissions in HSE West, at 295.7 per 100,000, marginally higher than that of the 18–19 year age group, at 295.1.

Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all and first admissions across all four HSE areas in 2014. Rates for all admissions ranged from 124.0 per 100,000 population in HSE West to 93.6 in Dublin North-East, while rates for first admissions ranged from 45.5 per 100,000 in HSE West to 33.0 in Dublin North-East. Schizophrenia had the second-highest rate for all and first admissions with rates for all admissions ranging from 82.1 in Dublin North-East to 71.0 in HSE West.

Twelve per cent of all admissions in HSE West, 12% in HSE South and 12% in Dublin North-East were involuntary, while 11% of all admissions in Dublin Mid-Leinster were involuntary in 2014. HSE West had the highest rate of involuntary all admissions, at 46.9 per 100,000, followed by HSE South, at 45.9, Dublin North-East, at 44.6 and Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 41.7. Fifteen per cent of first admissions in Dublin North-East, 13% in HSE South, 12% in Dublin Mid-Leinster and 12% in HSE West were involuntary. Dublin North-East had the highest rate of involuntary first admissions, at 18.0 per 100,000, followed by HSE South, at 17.9, Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 15.9 and HSE West, at 15.3.

Thirty-two per cent of all discharges for HSE West and 31% for Dublin North-East occurred within one week of admission, while 29% in HSE South and 28% in Dublin Mid-Leinster occurred within one week of admission. Almost three-quarters (72%) of all discharges in HSE West occurred within one month of admission, while 68% in HSE South, 66% in Dublin North-East and almost 63% (62.5%) in Dublin Mid-Leinster occurred within one month of admission. Over 93% of discharges in all areas occurred within three months of admission.

Average length of stay for all discharges was longest in Dublin North-East, at 85.8 days (median 15 days), followed by HSE South, at 82.1 days (median 15 days), Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 54.7 days (median 17 days) and HSE West, at 50.3 days (median 13 days). When discharges of one year or more were excluded, average length of stay was longest for Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 28.8 days (median 16 days), followed by Dublin North-East, at 26.3 days (median 14.0 days), HSE South, at 26.2 days (median 14 days) and HSE West, at 23.5 days (median 13 days).



Community Healthcare Organisations (CHOs)

All admission rates were highest for those resident in CHO 9, at 452.5 per 100,000, followed by CHO 7, at 407.3 and CHO 2, at 402.2. CHO 8 had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 348.8 per 100,000. First admissions were highest in CHO 2, at 150.7 per 100,000, followed by CHO 5, at 146.0 and CHO 9, at 143.3. CHO 1 had the lowest rate of first admission, at 100.3 per 100,000.

A higher proportion of males were admitted from CHO 2, CHO 4 and CHO 5, while a higher proportion of females were admitted from CHO 3, CHO 6, CHO 7 and CHO 9. The under 45 year age group had lower rates of admission in all areas than the 45 years and over age group with rates for the 45 years and over age group twice that of the under 45 year group in CHO 6 and CHO 8.

Depressive disorders accounted for the highest proportion of all admissions in each area and had the highest rate of all admissions in each area with rates ranging from 140.8 per 100,000 in CHO 2 to 80.7 in CHO 6.

Sixteen per cent of all and first admissions for CHO 1 were involuntary. CHO 8 had the lowest proportion of involuntary all and first admissions, at 8% and 9% respectively. CHO 9 had the highest rate of involuntary all and first admission, at 56.8 for all and 23.6 per 100,000 for first admissions.

More than half of all discharges for CHO 1 (55%), for CHO 2 (52%) and for CHO 5 (51%) were discharged within two weeks of admission, while only 40% were discharged within two weeks for CHO 6, with less than half discharged within two weeks in all other areas.

Average length of stay for all discharges was longest in CHO 4, at 98.0 days (median 16 days), followed by CHO 9, at 95.3 days (median 15 days) and CHO 8, at 66.4 days (median 15 days). CHO 7 had the shortest average length of stay, at 39.9 days (median 15 days). When discharges of one year or more were excluded average length of stay was longest in CHO 6, at 32.3 days (median 21 days), followed by CHO 4, at 27.3 days (median 15 days) and CHO 8, at 27.1 days (median 14 days).

Counties

All admission rates were highest for county Roscommon, at 505.7 per 100,000, followed by Carlow, at 461.4, Donegal, at 453.0, and Westmeath, at 450.3. Monaghan had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 191.8 per 100,000. Westmeath had the highest rate of first admissions, at 169.4 per 100,000, followed by Galway, at 166.4, Tipperary South, at 165.1 and Wexford, at 150.0. Longford had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 76.9 per 100,000.



Non-residents

There were 55 admissions for non-residents in 2014, practically unchanged from 2013 (54). Forty per cent of admissions for non-residents in 2014 had an address originating in Northern Ireland, 29% in England, 5.5% in Germany, and 4% each in France, in Italy, in the Netherlands and in the USA. Almost 35% (34.5%) of all admissions for non-residents had a primary admission diagnosis of schizophrenia, 22% had a diagnosis of mania, 16% had a diagnosis of depressive disorders and 9% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders.

Hospital type

Fifty-eight per cent of all admissions in 2014 were to general hospital psychiatric units, 24% were to independent/private and private charitable centres and 18% were to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (including the Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum; Carraig Mór, Cork; St Joseph's Intellectual Disability Service, Portrane; and Phoenix Care Centre, Dublin). Re-admissions accounted for 69% of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, 66% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 66% also to independent/private and private charitable centres.

Females accounted for 60% of all and 55% of first admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres. In contrast, males accounted for over half of all and first admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units; 52% of all and 58% of first admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 54% of all and 59% of first admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units.

Admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres had an older age profile than either general hospital psychiatric units or psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units; 61% of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres were aged 45 years and over compared with 42% to general hospital psychiatric units and 47% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units. Over half (58%) of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and over half (53%) of admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units were under 45 years of age compared with 39% to independent/private and private charitable centres. The mean age at admission in independent/private and private charitable centres was 50 (median 51) compared with 45 (median 43) in psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units and 43 (median 41) in general hospital psychiatric units.

One-third of all (35%) and first (32%) admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres had a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders; almost 27% of all and 29% of first admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 19% of all and 23% of first admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units were for depressive disorders.

Schizophrenia accounted for a much lower proportion of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres, at 6%, than admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, at 23% and psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 27%. Fourteen per cent of all admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres had a primary admission diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, three times that of admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 4% and twice that of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, at 6%. Similarly, the proportion of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres with a primary admission diagnosis of neurosis, at 13%, was twice that of admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 6% and almost twice that of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, at 8%.

Nineteen per cent of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units and 13% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units were involuntary compared with 2% of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres. The pattern for involuntary first admissions was similar, with 24% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, almost 15% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and just 2% to independent/private and private charitable centres.

One-third of all discharges from both general hospital psychiatric units (35%) and psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (33%) were discharged within one week of admission, compared with 14% of discharges from independent/private and private charitable centres. Over half of all discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (56%) and from psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (52%) occurred within two weeks of admission, compared with 24% of discharges from independent/private and private charitable centres.

Average length of stay for all discharges was longest for psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 220.6 days (median 12 days), followed by independent/private and private charitable centres, at 48.3 days (median 31 days) and general hospital psychiatric units, at 25.6 days (median 11 days). When discharges of one year or more were excluded independent/private and private charitable centres had the longest average length of stay, at 34.9 days (median 31 days), followed by psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 27.5 days (median 11 days) and general hospital psychiatric units, at 22.4 days (median 11 days).

Child and adolescent admissions

There were 436 admissions for under 18s to all hospital types in 2014, a small increase (21) in admissions from 2013 (415). Seventy-six per cent of all admissions for under 18s were first admissions. There were 343 admissions to specialised child



and adolescent in-patient units and 74% of these were first admissions. There were 93 admissions to adult units and hospitals for under 18s.

Almost 67% (66.5%) of all and 65% of first admissions for under 18s were female. Over one-third (36%) were aged 17 years of age on admission, 27% were aged 16 years, almost 19% were aged 15 years, 12% were aged 14 years, 4% were aged 13 years and 1% were aged 12 years or younger. Females accounted for 69% (68.5%) of all and 67% of first admissions to specialised child and adolescent in-patient units. Thirty-one per cent of all admissions to specialised child and adolescent in-patient units were 17 years of age on admission, 26% were aged 16 years, 22% were aged 15 years, almost 15% were aged 14 years, 5% were aged 13 years and 2% were aged 12 years or younger.

Of the 93 admissions to adult psychiatric units and hospitals, 53 were aged 17 years, 28 were aged 16 years, 8 were aged 15 years, 2 were aged 14 years and a further 2 were aged 13 years or younger.

Over one-third (34%) of all admissions for under 18s in 2014 had a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders, almost 14% had a diagnosis of eating disorders and 12% had a diagnosis of neuroses. Females accounted for 68% of all admissions with a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders, 93% of admissions with eating disorders and almost 62% of admissions with neuroses. Males accounted for 78% of admissions with a primary admission diagnosis of other drug disorders and 47% with schizophrenia.

Four per cent of all (16 admissions) and 3% of first admissions (9 admissions) for under 18s in 2014 were involuntary. Almost 38% of all involuntary admissions for under 18s had a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders, 25% had a diagnosis of other drug disorders and 19% had eating disorders.

Seventy-nine per cent of all admissions for under 18s were to specialised child and adolescent in-patient units, 19% were to general hospital psychiatric units and almost 3% were to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units. There were no admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres.

Almost 84% of under 18s admitted in 2014 were also discharged in 2014. Of those admitted and discharged in 2014, 18% were discharged within one week of admission, 10% were discharged within one to two weeks, 11% were discharged within two to four weeks, 45% were discharged within one to three months and 16% were discharged within three months to one year. The average length of stay for all under 18s admitted and discharged in 2014 was 48.8 days (median 37 days). Average length of stay

was longest in child and adolescent units, at 61.0 days (median 49.5), followed by psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 41.9 days (median 6 days), followed by general hospital psychiatric units, at 8.7 days (median 5 days).

In-patient census 2014

There were 2,228 patients resident on 31 December 2014, a rate of 48.6 per 100,000 total population. This is a decline in patients resident since 31 March 2013 by 173 and an 89% reduction in in-patient numbers since 1963. There were an additional 71 under 18s resident in specialist child and adolescent units on 31 December 2014.

Fifty-five per cent (1,216) of patients resident on 31 December 2014 were male. Thirty-five per cent (777) were aged 65 years and over, 33% (735) were aged 45-64 years, 26% (581) were aged 25-44 years and 6% (135) were aged 24 years or younger. There was only one patient aged under 18 years of age on 31 December 2014 resident in adult psychiatric units and hospitals. Sixty per cent of all patients resident were single, 19% were married, 6% widowed and 2% divorced.

Thirty-one per cent (689) had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 16% (354) depressive disorders and 12% (264) organic mental disorders. In-patients with a primary admission diagnosis of schizophrenia had the highest rate of hospitalisation, at 15.0 per 100,000 population, followed by depressive disorders, at 7.7 and organic mental disorders, at 5.8. Males had a higher rate of hospitalisation for schizophrenia than females, at 19.5 per 100,000, compared with 10.6 for females. Females had a higher rate for depressive disorders than males, at 9.1 per 100,000 for females and 6.3 for males.

Thirty-eight per cent (844) of residents were long-stay patients on census night, i.e. had been in hospital for one year or more; 16% (362) were new long-stay, i.e. in hospital for between one and five years and 22% (482) were old long-stay, i.e. in hospital for five years or more.

The total number of in-patient days for all patients on census night was 3,755,844; schizophrenia (689 patients) accounted for 42% of this total and intellectual disability (136 patients) accounted for 34%. The average length of stay for all patients was 1,685.75 (median 101 days). When patients with a length of stay of one year or more were excluded the average length of stay was 62.31 days (median 28 days), with the total number of in-patient days at 86,231. Schizophrenia (334 patients) accounted for 35% of in-patient days, organic mental disorders (107 patients) accounted for 15% and depressive disorders (298 patients) 14%.

Thirty-four per cent of patients resident on 31 December 2014 were in general hospital psychiatric units (up from 30% in 2013), 33% were in psychiatric hospitals/continuing



care units (down from 35% in 2013) and 22% were in independent/private and private charitable centres (down from 24% in 2013). Four per cent were in the Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum (unchanged from 2013), 5% were in St Joseph's Intellectual Disability Service (unchanged from 2013) and less than one per cent (0.94%) were in Carraig Mór, Cork (down slightly from 1.5% in 2013).

There were 72 under 18s resident on census night; 71 of these were resident in child and adolescent units and one resident in a general hospital psychiatric unit. Twenty-nine per cent were male and 71% female. Thirty-six per cent were aged 17 years on census night, 19% were aged 16 years, 21% were aged 15 years, 11% were 14 years and 12.5% were aged 13 years or younger. Twenty-nine per cent of under 18s had a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders, 24% had a diagnosis of eating disorders, 10% had a diagnosis of neuroses, 8% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia with a further 8% having a diagnosis of mania.

Ten-year review

There has been a 16% decline in admissions in the ten-year period from 2005–2014, from 21,253 in 2005 to 17,797 in 2014. Re-admissions have shown a greater level of decline during this period, at 23%, from 15,336 in 2005 to 11,855 in 2014. The overall number of first admissions has not changed over the last 40 years or so, from 6,210 in 1965 to 5,942 in 2014. There was an increase of 25 first admissions from 2005–2014, from 5,917 in 2005 to 5,942 in 2014.

In the ten-year period from 2005–2014 the proportion of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units increased from 49% in 2005 to 58% in 2014; the proportion of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres increased from 19% to 24% and admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units decreased from 32% to 18%.

Despite an initial decrease in the proportion of involuntary admissions following commencement of the Mental Health Act 2001, the proportion in recent years has been increasing year-on-year since 2008, from 7.6% of all and 8.1% of first admissions in 2008 to 12% of all and 13% of first admissions in 2014. These proportions are now almost in line with those of 2005, at 11% of all and 12% of first admissions, pointing to little or no change over the ten-year period, despite reductions in the intervening years.

In-patients resident in psychiatric units and hospitals have fallen from 3,475 in 2005 to 2,228 in 2014, a reduction of 36% in this ten-year period, in line with the policy to reduce in-patient provision and provide increased community-based care.

1 Introduction and Background Information

We are pleased to present our annual report on the activities of Irish psychiatric in-patient services for the year 2014, the 44th consecutive year for which data has been returned to the National Psychiatric In-patient Reporting System (NPIRS) and presented for publication. As always, we thank all our NPIRS contacts in approved centres throughout the country without whose cooperation and commitment none of this would be possible. The NPIRS Team liaises closely with all its stakeholders involved in the collection of mental health information. The NPIRS data standards are reviewed annually along with the NPIRS training manual. Training and visits to approved centres continued in 2014, with further training and visits planned in 2015. The team continuously strives to review and update the database and the variables collected in terms of their relevance to the mental health services. This year, in response to stakeholders' requests for an annual census to be carried out, the report includes the results of such a census taken from the database on 31 December. It is hoped that an annual census will be taken at the end of each reporting year and results presented in the annual Activities report.

The annual reports produced from the database continue to play a key role in the planning of service delivery. National and regional bulletins capturing data for the HSE areas, along with an in-patient census carried out every three years, are also produced from the database. The database also provides data on Performance Indicators (PIs) for the mental health services which are used to monitor targets in certain key areas of the services.

The NPIRS Team continues to work closely with the Mental Health Commission (MHC). A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed by the HRB and the MHC in 2008, allowing for cooperation in areas of mutual interest regarding mental health information and for close liaison between the two agencies in an effort to avoid, where possible, areas of duplication in the collection of mental health information. As part of the MOU, the HRB agreed to collect data for NPIRS from all centres approved under the Mental Health Act 2001. As new centres become approved, they are contacted by the NPIRS Team to request submission of activity data to the NPIRS. Another key facet of the MOU was the agreement by the HRB to undertake a psychiatric in-patient census every three years, commencing in 2010. The results of the last census carried out in 2013 are available in the *Irish Psychiatric Units and Hospitals Census 2013* (Daly and Walsh 2014).



This report presents cross-sectional data on admissions, discharges and deaths for psychiatric in-patient facilities in Ireland in 2014. Data are presented nationally, regionally (HSE area and for the first time CHO area), and locally (by county, by hospital type and by individual unit and hospital). Data on admissions for children and adolescents, i.e. those under 18 years of age and those admitted to in-patient child and adolescent services, are presented separately in Chapter 5. Data on admissions to the dedicated child and adolescent units (CAMHS, Galway; Linn Dara Child and Adolescent In-patient Unit, Dublin; Ginesa Unit, St John of God Hospital, Dublin; St Joseph's Adolescent In-patient Unit; Willow Grove Adolescent In-patient Unit; and Éist Linn Child and Adolescent In-patient Unit, Cork) are included in that chapter, along with data on admissions to units and hospitals for persons under 18 years of age.

Comparative data for 2013 used throughout the report are from the publication *Activities of Irish Psychiatric Units and Hospitals 2013: Main Findings* (Daly and Walsh 2014) and rates reported are per 100,000 total population.

More detailed analysis of the data presented in this report is available on request. A data request form including the terms and conditions concerning the use of data supplied from the NPIRS, along with an information document regarding the database, *Information for users of the NPIRS database*, can be downloaded from the HRB website www.hrb.ie. This information document outlines the variables collected and records changes in the database over the years. A privacy and confidentiality policy document entitled *Privacy and Confidentiality Policy relating to data held in the National Health Information Systems Unit (NHIS Unit) including procedures for the request and release of data* is also available on the HRB website (www.hrb.ie) and it is advised that this document be consulted before requests for data are submitted to the NPIRS Team.

Interactive tables containing data for each year are available at http://www.cso.ie/px/pxeirestat/pssn/hrb/homepagefiles/hrb_statbank.asp. This allows the user to access readily-available data from the database over the last number of years. This initiative was developed in conjunction with the Central Statistics Office (CSO) and we plan to expand the number of years available for users and to also upload the in-patient census data to this site.



Data coverage and collection

Data on admissions to, and discharges from, 64 general hospital psychiatric units, psychiatric hospitals, independent/private and private charitable centres, child and adolescent units and the Central Mental Hospital (CMH) are included in this report. A breakdown of each hospital type for 2014 is presented in Table 1.1.

Hospitals and units included in this report are all those on the Register of Approved Centres under the Mental Health Act 2001. One new approved centre opened in 2014, while three closed. Table 1.2 below outlines the centres which opened and closed during the year.

As in previous years a number of issues with various hospitals/centres should be noted. The acute unit in St Brigid's Hospital, Ballinasloe closed at the end of March 2014 and all acute admissions are now directed to the Department of Psychiatry in University College Hospital Galway. This will affect numbers and rates for these catchment areas.

The original date of admission for long-stay patients transferred from St Loman's Hospital, Mullingar, to Cluain Lir Care Centre, Mullingar, was preserved to maintain their length of stay in the in-patient services. Similarly, discharges from Selskar House, Farnogue Residential Healthcare Unit, Enniscorthy may include patients who were originally admitted to St Senan's Hospital, Enniscorthy, discharges from Heywood Lodge, Clonmel may include patients originally admitted to St Luke's Hospital, Clonmel, and discharges from the Ashlin Centre in Beaumont hospital may include patients originally admitted to Hawthorn Unit Connolly Hospital or Joyce Rooms, Fairview Community Unit.

Phoenix Care Centre, which opened in May 2013, accommodated some patients transferred from St Brendan's Hospital, which closed during 2013. This centre covers the catchment area of Dublin city and county but also extends northwards to the counties of Louth, Meath, Cavan and Monaghan and southwards to County Wicklow (excluding West Wicklow).

In 2014, as in 2013, six beds in the Department of Psychiatry, Midland Regional Hospital, Portlaoise, were allocated to patients from Lakeview Unit, Naas General Hospital. As this report is activity-based, admissions for these patients from Lakeview Unit are included in figures for the Midland Regional Hospital, Portlaoise.

Since 2012 admissions to the Cluain Mhuire Service include admissions where private health insurance was invoked. Prior to 2012, these admissions were not included as admissions to Cluain Mhuire but were included as private admissions to St John of God Hospital (at year end in the NPIRS annual Activities report). Thus, an increase in admissions to Cluain Mhuire may be noticed in comparison with previous years.

Differences in data reported for child and adolescent admissions should be noted between the MHC's annual inspectorate report (Mental Health Commission 2015) and data in this report. Admissions for children and adolescents in this report include all admissions for persons under 18 years of age, regardless of their marital status, whereas the MHC's data on admissions for children and adolescents include admissions for children as defined under the Mental Health Act 2001, i.e. a child is defined as a person under the age of 18 years other than a person who is or has been married.



Data for the NPIRS were returned quarterly to the NPIRS Team in the HRB, either electronically or manually, according to agreed specifications. With the manual system, completed forms were returned to personnel at the HRB in accordance with procedures and practices established over a number of years. Personnel at the HRB code and process the data and maintain on-going liaison with hospital personnel. The admission and discharge form used to collect data from hospitals is presented in Appendix 1.

Quality assurance and validation of data

Data received from units and hospitals for the NPIRS are subjected to various in-built and manual quality assurance and validation measures, according to policies and procedures employed by the NPIRS Team. Data are cleaned and validated upon receipt and import of data into the database, prior to the return of quarterly status reports to units and hospitals, prior to the return of annual status reports, and at year end in preparation for this report. All units and hospitals are required to sign off on final admission and discharge data for the year in advance of the preparation of this report.

Legal status

The legal status recorded by NPIRS is that recorded on admission, and while changes may occur in legal status following admission, this is not recorded by the NPIRS. It is therefore important to note that data on legal status presented in this report differs from that usually reported by the MHC in its annual report. Data contained here do not include data on Form 13 – Admission Order to Detain a Voluntary Patient (Adult) followed by an involuntary admission order, whereas MHC figures do. This is the re-grading of the legal status of a voluntary patient to involuntary.

Transfers

NPIRS does not record information on transfers because under Sections 20 and 21 of the Mental Health Act 2001, transfers of detained patients either to another approved centre or to the Central Mental Hospital (CMH) remain patients of the centre from which they are transferred. Transfers to the CMH (the only centre so far designated for the reception of such transfers) from the courts and prisons are regulated by the Criminal Law Insanity Act 2006. Patients detained in approved centres can be transferred to the CMH but only following authorisation by a mental health tribunal as provided for by the Mental Health Act 2001.



Computation of rates

The rates accompanying numerical data in this report were calculated using the Census of Population 2011 (Central Statistics Office 2012). All data were rated to the total population. In previous years, rates were calculated per 100,000 population aged 16 years and over and also per 100,000 population aged 15 years and over. However, in more recent years, it was decided to revert to using total population as the denominator as this is the standard used internationally and it thus allows comparative analysis.

Population figures for 2011 for HSE areas by socio-economic group could not be used to calculate rates because the population figures for socio-economic groups were not available by HSE areas. The census data produced by the CSO for socio-economic groups by electoral divisions (EDs) related to the socio-economic group of the reference person/household rather than every person resident in the state on census night. Thus, it was not possible to calculate the socio-economic group for the total population for each HSE area.

Health Service Executive (HSE) Areas

The composition of HSE areas and the Mental Health Catchment Areas (MHCAs)/Local Health Offices (LHOs) (with which MHCAs are generally coterminous) that comprise HSE areas, consist of electoral divisions (EDs). Population figures using the 2011 census of population for the HSE areas have been calculated using previously agreed EDs for each area. As mentioned above, population figures for socio-economic groups were not available by HSE area because these data by ED related to the socio-economic group of the reference person/household rather than every person resident in the state on census night.

All LHOs were requested to confirm their agreement with the updated population figures and, although confirmation for some areas still remained outstanding at the time of production of this report, the figures used by the HRB were deemed appropriate as they were based on previously agreed configurations.

In this report, the address from which a person was admitted was used to assign him/her to a HSE area. Thus, HSE area refers to the HSE area of residence of the person. In contrast, HSE area, as reported by the MHC, is determined by the location of the approved centre to which a person was admitted, i.e. HSE area of hospitalisation. Thus, data on involuntary admissions by HSE areas presented in this report differ from those reported by the MHC due to differences in assigning persons to a HSE area.

Population figures based on CSO census data for 2011 for each HSE area are presented below in Table 1.3. The four HSE areas are broadly similar in terms of the total population.




Figure 1.1 Health Service Executive Areas 2014

Community Healthcare Organisations (CHOs)

The HSE published the report *Community Healthcare Organisations – Report and Recommendations of the Integrated Service Area Review Group* in October 2014 and this provided a framework for new governance and organisational structures for community health care services. Central to the report was the establishment of nine Community Healthcare Organisations to deliver an integrated model of care. There are some similarities between the new areas and the old health board areas. The population of the new areas have been calculated based on previously agreed configurations for each MHCA and LHO and are presented in Appendix 2. Work on finalising borders and populations for some areas is ongoing but in the interim existing agreed populations have been used. The composition of each area and the approved centres in each area is presented in Appendix 4.

Diagnosis

The diagnostic groups in this report are based on the WHO International Classification of Diseases categories (ICD-10, WHO 1992) and are presented in Table 1.4. From 2004, the ICD-10 diagnostic codes were assembled by us into new, more appropriate groupings. Therefore, some groups are not entirely comparable with diagnostic categories used prior to the 2004 report. Only three of the new categories are directly comparable to the old categories: alcoholic disorders, other drug disorders and intellectual disability.

Eating disorders, developmental disorders, and behavioural, emotional disorders of childhood and adolescence are presented as individual entities, whereas previously these three categories were included in the neuroses and personality disorder groupings. However, it should be pointed out that organic, schizophrenic, depressive and manic conditions arising in childhood and adolescence are included in the 'F' codes appropriate to these disorders and are not presented as disorders of childhood and adolescence. Finally, ICD-10 uses the term 'mental retardation', but our grouping is of 'intellectual disability' to accord with current Irish usage.

Limitations

While every effort is made to ensure that data are of the highest quality and while the NPIRS Team engages with the mental health services and engages in continuous quality assurance activities relating to the database, a number of limitations to the data should be noted.

Any change in admissions or discharges over time or any comparisons with previous or subsequent years must be interpreted with caution and must take into account additional facilities submitting data in any given year and/or approved centres closing in any given year. In 2014, one additional in-patient facility became an approved centre under the Mental Health Act 2001 and submitted data to the NPIRS for 2014, while three centres were removed from the Register of Approved Centres. In addition, as mentioned earlier, data presented by the MHC and those presented here may differ due to reasons already outlined.

Population rates for public catchment areas are calculated on the basis of total populations and, accordingly, include privately insured persons who are more likely to use private services. Since the proportion of privately medically insured persons differs between catchment areas, rates will be inflated in some catchments with a high proportion of such persons who do not depend on public services. As, for the moment, we are unable to adjust for this inflation of denominator catchment populations, comparison of rates between catchments should be done with caution.



As some services do not provide a preliminary diagnosis on admission, but rather supply diagnoses on discharge, diagnostic data on admissions not discharged by the end of the year during which they have been admitted are not available for those services. In these instances, a number of admissions have been returned with unspecified diagnoses and, therefore, the 'Other and unspecified' diagnostic category includes those with an unspecified mental disorder (F99) and those for whom no diagnosis had been assigned at the time of submission of data to the NPIRS Team. A number of hospitals also indicated having difficulty obtaining diagnoses for admissions/discharges from medical personnel and this is also reflected in the number of admissions/discharges returned with unspecified diagnoses. It is particularly disappointing that some hospitals continue to report this problem despite on-going requests and the increasing emphasis on evidence-based information to inform service planning and delivery. This will inevitably affect the rates reported for diagnoses and, in particular, tables relating to individual units and hospitals and their respective catchment areas.

The collection of information relating to socio-economic group continues to pose a major problem for many units and hospitals. In 2014, 50% of occupations were returned as unknown, rendering assignment to a socio-economic group impossible. This should be borne in mind when interpreting tables and figures relating to socio-economic group.

The issue of recording data on patients who are transferred between units and hospitals has been a continuing problem for many hospitals. The difficulties have been accentuated by the increasing number of catchment areas where general hospital psychiatric units operate and the psychiatric hospital remains open in the same catchment and transfers occur between the two, although with the continuing closure of original psychiatric hospitals this is a diminishing problem. This is in addition to transfers from one catchment area to another and of the small number of transfers to the CMH. Transfers to general hospitals for medical, surgical or other treatment are not required for HRB reporting purposes as this would lead to the loss of valuable length-of-stay information given that, while in the general hospital, patients, unless discharged, on legal grounds remain 'on the books' of the transferring hospital.

Section 14(2) of the Mental Health Act 2001 requires a patient/person presenting with an application and recommendation for involuntary admission to be examined by a consultant psychiatrist within 24 hours. At this examination, some may be deemed not to have a mental illness or a mental illness not warranting admission and therefore not admitted. Such patients may have been recorded by the centre as having been admitted, albeit for a short period of time, i.e. less than 24 hours and may be reflected in the admission figures in this report, although it is likely that the numbers are small. From 2009, the NPIRS Team has requested that persons should only be returned as admitted when the admission order is



made or they have been admitted voluntarily; those not admitted following examination by a consultant within 24 hours are not recorded as an admission.

Admissions and discharges represent episodes or events rather than persons. Thus, one person may have several admissions during the course of a year and each admission is recorded separately. Admissions do not necessarily represent incidence of mental illness but rather the activity of in-patient services. Throughout the country there may be considerable differences in admission rates from service to service, but this does not necessarily indicate variations in incidence and may simply reflect differing admission practices.



2 National and Regional (HSE) Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

National all and first admissions

There were 17,797 admissions to Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2014, a rate of 387.9 per 100,000 total population (Table 2.1 and Table 2.2). This is a decrease of 660 admissions from 2013 (18,457) and also a decrease in the rate of admissions from 402.3 in 2013 to 387.9 in 2014. First admission numbers also decreased by 113 from 6,055 in 2013 to 5,942 in 2014, while the rate of first admissions similarly decreased from 132.0 in 2013 to 129.5 in 2014. Re-admissions declined from 12,402 in 2013 to 11,855 in 2014, with the proportion of admissions that were re-admissions remaining the same at 67%. The rate of re-admissions decreased from 270.3 in 2013 to 258.4 in 2014.

Approved centres reported an additional ten persons presenting for admission in 2014 who were not subsequently admitted following clinical examination.




Figure 2.1 All, first and re-admissions. Ireland 1965–2014. Numbers

Admission numbers reached a peak of 29,392 in 1986 but have been declining steadily since then (Figure 2.1 and Table 2.1). There has been a 16% decline in admissions in the ten-year period from 2005–2014, from 21,253 in 2005 to 17,797 in 2014. Re-admissions have shown a greater level of decline during this period, at 23%, from 15,336 in 2005 to 11,855 in 2014. The overall number of first admissions has not changed over the last 40 years or so, from 6,210 in 1965 to 5,942 in 2014. There was an increase of 25 first admissions from 2005–2014, from 5,917 in 2005 to 5,942 in 2014.

Gender and age

There was an equal proportion of male and female admissions, with rates being almost the same, at 388.7 per 100,000 for males and 387.1 for females (Table 2.3). Males accounted for a higher proportion of first admissions, at 55% and similarly had a higher rate of first admissions, at 143.9 compared with 115.4 for females.

The 45–54 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions, at 570.4 per 100,000, followed by the 55–64 year age group, at 548.0, and the 20–24 year age group, at 544.0 (Table 2.3). The 75 year and over age group had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 432.0 per 100,000. The 18–19 year age group had the highest rate of first admissions, at 262.5 per 100,000 population, followed by the 20–24 year age group, at 240.9 and the 75 year and over age group, at 196.9. The 55–64 year age group had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 140.7 per 100,000. The mean age at admission was 44.83 (median 43; minimum age 13 and maximum 98).

Marital status

Single persons accounted for 57% of all and 53% of first admissions. Married persons accounted for 26% of all admissions, widowed accounted for 4% and divorced also accounted for 4%. Divorced persons had the highest rate of all admissions, at 744.0 per 100,000 despite accounting for just 4% of all admissions. Single persons had the second-highest rate of all admissions, at 407.4, followed by widowed persons, at 373.2 (Table 2.4). Married persons had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 267.3. Divorced persons had the highest rate of first admissions, at 206.2, followed by widowed



persons, at 140.3 and single persons, at 127.1. Married persons had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 99.6 per 100,000.

Females who were married (297.5) or divorced (807.1) had higher rates of all admissions than their male counterparts (237.2 for married males and 661.7 for divorced males) (Table 2.4), while males who were single (432.5) or widowed (376.0) had higher rates than single (380.6) or widowed (372.4) females.

Socio-economic group

The unskilled occupational group had the highest rate of all (670.0) and first admissions (181.6) in keeping with the trends in previous years (Table 2.5). However, it must be noted that 50% of occupations were returned as unknown or unspecified, making assignment to a socio-economic group impossible. The semi-skilled group had the second-highest rate of all admissions, at 284.4 per 100,000, followed by manual skilled, at 273.3 and non-manual, at 265.6. Employers and managers had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 81.8 per 100,000, followed closely by own account workers, at 88.9. Farmers had the second-highest rate of first admissions, at 90.2, followed by agricultural workers, at 89.3 and manual skilled, at 88.7 per 100,000 (Table 2.5). Employers and managers had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 24.4 per 100,000.

Principal economic status

Forty-one per cent of all admissions in 2014 were returned as unemployed, 27% as employed, 9% as retired, 6% as students, 5% as engaged in house duties, while 12% were returned as unknown.

Ethnicity

Almost 85% of all admissions in 2014 were returned as 'White Irish', 6% were returned as 'Any Other White Background' (including White Irish Traveller, White Roma and Any Other White Background) and 2% were distributed amongst various other ethnic groups. Eight per cent were returned as 'Unknown/unspecified'.

Primary admission diagnosis

As in previous years depressive disorders were the most common diagnoses recorded for all admissions, accounting for 27% of all and 29% of first admissions and 26% of re-admissions (Table 2.6a and Table 2.6b). Rates for depressive disorders for all and first admissions were higher than for all other diagnoses, at 105.3 per 100,000 for all and 37.4 for first admissions. Schizophrenia accounted for 20% of all, 15% of first and almost 23% of re-admissions and had the second-highest rate of all and

first admissions, at 77.2 per 100,000 for all and 18.9 for first. Mania accounted for 12% of all, 7% of first and 14% of re-admissions and had the third-highest rate of all admissions, at 45.3 per 100,000. Neuroses accounted for 9% of all, 12% of first and 7% of re-admissions.

Females had higher rates of all admissions for depressive disorders, at 114.7 per 100,000 compared with 95.7 for males (Table 2.6a). In contrast, males had a marginally higher rate of first admissions for depressive disorders, at 38.6 per 100,000 compared with 36.3 for females. Males had higher rates of all and first admissions for organic mental disorders, alcoholic disorders, other drug disorders and schizophrenia compared with their female counterparts.

Legal status

Twelve per cent (11.6%) of all and 13% of first admissions were involuntary, a marginal increase from 11% of all and 12% of first in 2013 (Table 2.7a). The rate of involuntary all admissions also increased from 44.4 per 100,000 in 2013 to 45.0 in 2014, while the first admission rate also increased from 15.7 in 2013 to 17.1 in 2014 (Table 2.7b). As noted in 2013, despite an initial decrease in the proportion of involuntary admissions following commencement of the Mental Health Act 2001, the proportion in recent years has been increasing almost year-on-year since 2008, from 7.6% of all and 8.1% of first admissions in 2008 to 12% of all and 13% of first in 2014. All admissions for schizophrenia had the highest rate of involuntary admission, at 18.9 per 100,000, followed by mania, at 8.7 and depressive disorders, at 4.5 (Table 2.8). As noted earlier data on legal status differ from that reported by the MHC.

No fixed abode

There were 253 admissions with no fixed abode in 2014. Sixty-seven per cent of these were male, 77% were single, 25% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 19% had a diagnosis of other drug disorders and 12% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders.

National discharges and deaths

There were 17,643 discharges and 142 deaths in Irish psychiatric units and hospitals in 2014 (Table 2.9). Males accounted for 62% of all deaths in 2014, and 80% of those who died were aged 65 years and over (Table 2.10).

Ninety-two per cent of all those admitted in 2014 and 93% of first admissions in 2014 were discharged in 2014.



Length of stay

Almost one-third (30%) of all discharges in 2014 took place within one week of admission, 18% occurred within two weeks, 19% occurred within two to four weeks and 27% occurred within one to three months (Table 2.11). Ninety-four per cent of all discharges occurred within three months of admission.

Over half (51%) of all discharges with a diagnosis of other drug disorders, almost half of those with personality disorders (49.5%) and 41% of those with intellectual disability were discharged within one week of admission (Table 2.11). Over 90% of discharges for most disorders occurred within three months of admission with the exception of organic mental disorders (76%), intellectual disability (80.5%) and development disorders (80.8%) (Table 2.11).

Thirty-two per cent of discharges in 2014 who were admitted voluntarily occurred within one week of admission, compared with 15% of discharges who were admitted involuntarily (Table 2.12). Half of discharges in 2014 who were admitted voluntarily were discharged within two weeks compared with 29% of discharges who were admitted involuntarily.

In-patient days

Analysis of in-patient days for all discharges including deaths is presented in Table 2.13a while a similar analysis for lengths of stay of up to one year is presented in Table 2.13b. A total of 239 discharges (1% of all discharges) were removed from this latter analysis as they distort the number of bed days due to the small number of discharges with considerably long lengths of stay. This is evident from the difference in the average length of stay for both tables; the average length of stay for all discharges in 2014 was 67.1 days (median 15 days), while that for discharges up to one year in hospital was 26.3 days (median 14 days).

Average length of stay for all discharges was longest for discharges with intellectual disability (128 discharges), at 1,162.6 days (median 10 days), accounting for less than one per cent of all discharges and 12% of all in-patient days (Table 2.14a). Discharges with a diagnosis of organic mental disorders had the second-longest average length of stay, at 202.8 days (median 31 days), accounting for 3% of all discharges and 9.5% of all in-patient days.

Discharges with a primary discharge diagnosis of organic mental disorders had the longest average length of stay, excluding discharges with a length of stay of one year



or more, at 48.5 days (median 24 days), followed by eating disorders, at 39.6 days (median 27 days) and schizophrenia, at 34.5 days (median 20 days) (Table 2.14b). Discharges with a diagnosis of behavioural and emotional disorders of childhood and adolescence had the shortest average length of stay, at 10.7 days (median 5 days).

Health Service Executive (HSE) Areas

All and first admissions

Almost 30% of all admissions in 2014 were resident in Dublin Mid-Leinster, 22% were resident in Dublin North-East, almost 25% were resident in HSE South and 24% were resident in HSE West (Table 2.15). Less than one per cent (55 admissions) of all admissions was recorded as non-resident on admission.

HSE West had the highest rate of all admissions, at 392.6 per 100,000, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 388.5, HSE South, at 386.0 and Dublin North-East, at 378.7 (Table 2.15). HSE South had the highest rate of first admissions, at 134.0 per 100,000, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 129.9, HSE West, at 127.5 and Dublin North-East, at 122.0 (Table 2.15).

The proportion of admissions that were re-admissions was similar in all HSE areas, ranging from 68% in Dublin North-East to 65% in HSE South. HSE West had the highest rate of re-admissions, at 265.1 per 100,000, followed by Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 258.7, Dublin North-East, at 256.6 and HSE South, at 252.1 (Table 2.15).

Gender and age

Females had higher rates of all admissions than males in Dublin Mid-Leinster (405.8 for females and 370.6 for males), Dublin North-East (385.3 for females and 371.8 for males) and in HSE West (397.4 for females and 387.8 for males) (Table 2.15). Males had higher rates of all admissions in HSE South, at 419.4 per 100,000, compared with 353.0 for females. Males had higher rates of first admissions than females in all areas with rates ranging from 161.5 per 100,000 in HSE South to 130.2 in Dublin North-East.

The 55–64 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions in Dublin Mid-Leinster and in Dublin North-East, at 603.5 and 578.5 per 100,000 respectively (Table 2.16). The 20–24 year age group had the highest rate of all admissions in HSE South, at 636.3, while the 35–44 year age group had the highest rate in HSE West, at 581.5.



The 75 year and over age group had the highest rate of first admissions in Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 253.0 per 100,000, while the 18–19 year age group had the highest rate in both Dublin North-East and HSE South with rates of 234.3 and 279.3 respectively (Table 2.17). The 20–24 year age group had the highest rate of first admissions in HSE West, at 295.7 per 100,000, marginally higher than that of the 18–19 year age group, at 295.1.




Figure 2.2 Health Service Executive Areas. All admissions. Ireland 2014.
Rates per 100,000 total population






Figure 2.3 Health Service Executive Areas. First admissions. Ireland 2014.




Figure 2.4 Health Service Executive Areas. All admissions by age category. Ireland 2014. Rates per 100,000 total population

Age groups were condensed into two distinct groups, under 45 years and 45 years and over. The 45 years and over group had the highest rate of admissions in all HSE areas, with rates ranging from 585.7 in Dublin Mid-Leinster to 489.4 in HSE South (Figure 2.4). Rates for the under 45 year group ranged from 333.0 in HSE West to 291.8 in Dublin Mid-Leinster.

Marital status

Divorced persons had the highest rate of all admissions in all four HSE areas, with rates ranging from 864.6 per 100,000 in Dublin North-East to 631.0 in HSE West (Table 2.18). Married persons had the lowest rate of all admissions in all areas with rates ranging from 292.2 per 100,000 in Dublin Mid-Leinster to 245.1 in HSE South. Divorced persons had the highest rate of first admissions in Dublin Mid-Leinster (203.2), Dublin North-East (216.1) and in HSE South (255.6), while single persons had the highest rate of first admission in HSE West, at 125.5. As with all admissions, married persons had the lowest rate of first admissions, ranging from 107.4 per 100,000 in Dublin Mid-Leinster to 95.4 in Dublin North-East.

Socio-economic group¹

Non-manual occupations accounted for the highest proportion of all and first admissions, ranging from 16% of all admissions in HSE South to 12% in HSE West (Table 2.19) and ranging from 15% of first admissions in HSE South to 11% in HSE West (Table 2.19). As noted earlier however, data for socio-economic group should be interpreted with caution as 50% of all occupations were returned as unknown in 2014 thus making assignment to a socio-economic group impossible for these occupations.

¹ Rates for socio-economic group by HSE area could not be calculated for 2014 as the breakdown by persons was not produced in the Small Area Population Statistics for 2011. The data produced for EDs related to the socio-economic group of the reference person and household rather than every person resident in the state on census night. Thus, it was not possible to calculate the socio-economic group for the total population for each HSE area.

Primary admission diagnosis




Figure 2.5 Health Service Executive Areas. All admissions by selected diagnoses. Ireland 2014. Rates per 100,000 total population




Figure 2.6 Health Service Executive Areas. First admissions by selected diagnoses. Ireland 2014. Rates per 100,000 total population

Depressive disorders had the highest rate of all and first admissions across all four HSE areas in 2014. Rates for all admissions ranged from 124.0 per 100,000 population in HSE West to 93.6 in Dublin North-East (Table 2.21 and Figure 2.5), while rates for first admissions ranged from 45.5 per 100,000 in HSE West to 33.0 in Dublin North-East (Table 2.22 and Figure 2.6). Schizophrenia had the second-highest rate for all and first admissions with rates for all admissions ranging from 82.1 in Dublin North-East to 71.0 in HSE West (Table 2.21).

Legal status

Twelve per cent of all admissions in HSE West, 12% in HSE South and 12% in Dublin North-East were involuntary (Table 2.23). Eleven per cent of all admissions in Dublin Mid-Leinster were involuntary in 2014. Fifteen per cent of first admissions in Dublin North-East, 13% in HSE South, 12% in Dublin Mid-Leinster and 12% in HSE West were involuntary (Table 2.23).

HSE West had the highest rate of involuntary all admissions, at 46.9 per 100,000, followed by HSE South, at 45.9, Dublin North-East, at 44.6 and Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 41.7 (Table 2.23). Dublin North-East had the highest rate of involuntary first admissions, at 18.0 per 100,000, followed by HSE South, at 17.9, Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 15.9 and HSE West, at 15.3 (Table 2.23).




Figure 2.7 Health Service Executive Areas. All and first involuntary admissions. Ireland 2014. Rates per 100,000 total population

Length of stay

Thirty-two per cent of all discharges for HSE West, 31% for Dublin North-East, 29% in HSE South and 28% in Dublin Mid-Leinster occurred within one week of admission (Table 2.24). Almost three-quarters (72%) of all discharges in HSE West occurred within one month of admission, followed by 68% in HSE South, 66% in Dublin North-East and almost 63% (62.5%) in Dublin Mid-Leinster. Over 93% of discharges in all areas occurred within three months of admission.

Average length of stay for all discharges was longest in Dublin North-East, at 85.8 days (median 15 days), followed by HSE South, at 82.1 days (median 15 days), Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 54.7 days (median 17 days) and HSE West, at 50.3 days (median 13 days)

(Table 2.26a). When discharges of one year or more were excluded, average length of stay was longest for Dublin Mid-Leinster, at 28.8 days (median 16 days), followed by Dublin North-East, at 26.3 days (median 14.0 days), HSE South, at 26.2 days (median 14 days) and HSE West, at 23.5 days (median 13 days) (Table 2.26b).

Community Healthcare Organisations (CHOs)

All and first admissions

Although the CHOs were only established in January 2015 we have provided some analysis of the 2014 data by CHOs. Analysis by CHO is based on the area of residence of the admission rather than the unit or hospital to which the admission presented. Tables for CHOs are presented in Appendix 3. The composition of CHOs and the approved centres within each CHO is presented in Appendix 4.

All admission rates were highest for those resident in CHO 9, at 452.5 per 100,000, followed by CHO 7, at 407.3 and CHO 2, at 402.2 (Table A3.1). CHO 8 had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 348.8 per 100,000.

First admissions were highest in CHO 2, at 150.7 per 100,000, followed by CHO 5, at 146.0 and CHO 9, at 143.3 (Table A3.1). CHO 1 had the lowest rate of first admission, at 100.3 per 100,000.

The proportion of admissions that were re-admissions was highest in CHO 1, at 71%, followed by CHO 3, at 69% and CHO 6 also at 69% (Table A3.1). CHO 9 had the highest rate of re-admissions, at 309.2 per 100,000, followed by CHO 7, at 264.6 and CHO 4, at 260.9.

Gender and age

While some areas had an almost equal ratio of male/female admissions, a higher proportion of males were admitted from CHO 2, CHO 4 and CHO 5, with a higher proportion of females from CHO 3, CHO 6, CHO 7 and CHO 9 (Table A3.1).

The under 45 year age group had lower rates of admission in all areas than the 45 year and over age group (Table A3.2). The rate of admission for the 45 year and over age group was twice that of the under 45 year group in CHO 6 and CHO 8; 562.5 per 100,000 for the 45 year and over group and 243.8 for the under 45 year group in CHO 6; 541.7 for the 45 year and over and 256.0 for the under 45 year group in CHO 8.



Marital status

Divorced persons had the highest rate of all admissions in each area with rates ranging from 965.9 per 100,000 in CHO 9 to 397.8 in CHO 3 (Table A3.3). Single persons had the highest rate of first admissions in CHO 2, at 159.8 per 100,000; Widowed had the highest in CHO 3, at 168.4 and in CHO 6, at 199.7 while divorced had the highest in all other areas (Table A3.3).

Primary admission diagnosis

Depressive disorders accounted for the highest proportion of all admissions in each area and had the highest rate of all admissions in each area with rates ranging from 140.8 per 100,000 in CHO 2 to 80.7 in CHO 6 (Table A3.4).

Legal status

Sixteen per cent of all and first admissions for CHO 1 were involuntary (Table A3.5). CHO 8 had the lowest proportion of involuntary all and first admissions, at 8% and 9% respectively. CHO 9 had the highest rate of involuntary all and first admissions, at 56.8 for all and 23.6 per 100,000 for first admissions. CHO 1 had the second-highest rate of involuntary all admissions, at 54.8 per 100,000, followed by CHO 5, at 48.4. CHO 8 had the lowest rate of involuntary all admissions, at 29.5 per 100,000. CHO 5 had the second-highest rate of involuntary first admissions, at 21.3 per 100,000, followed by CHO 7, at 17.6. As with all admissions, CHO 8 had the lowest rate of involuntary first admissions, at 9.8 per 100,000.

Length of stay

More than half of all discharges for CHO 1 (55%), for CHO 2 (52%) and for CHO 5 (51%) were discharged within two weeks of admission (Table A3.6). In contrast, only 40% were discharged within two weeks for CHO 6, with less than half discharged within two weeks in all other areas.

Average length of stay for all discharges was longest in CHO 4, at 98.0 days (median 16 days), followed by CHO 9, at 95.3 days (median 15 days) and CHO 8, at 66.4 days (median 15 days) (Table A3.7). CHO 7 had the shortest average length of stay, at 39.9 days (median 15 days). When discharges of one year or more were excluded average length of stay was longest in CHO 6, at 32.3 days (median 21 days), followed by CHO 4, at 27.3 days (median 15 days) and CHO 8, at 27.1 days (median 14 days) (Table A3.8).

Counties




Figure 2.8 All admissions by county. Ireland 2014. Rates per 100,000 total population




Figure 2.9 First admissions by county. Ireland 2014. Rates per 100,000 total population

Table 2.27a and Table 2.27b, along with Figure 2.8 and Figure 2.9, present all and first admission rates by county of residence for 2014. Admissions for non-residents (55) were excluded from the analysis.

All admission rates were highest for county Roscommon, at 505.7 per 100,000, followed by Carlow, at 461.4, Donegal, at 453.0, and Westmeath, at 450.3 (Table 2.27a). Monaghan had the lowest rate of all admissions, at 191.8 per 100,000. Westmeath had the highest rate of first admissions, at 169.4 per 100,000, followed by Galway, at 166.4, Tipperary South, at 165.1 and Wexford, at 150.0 (Table 2.27b). Longford had the lowest rate of first admissions, at 76.9 per 100,000.

Primary admission diagnosis

As in 2013, Mayo had the highest rate of all admissions for depressive disorders in 2014, at 232.7, followed by Roscommon, at 149.8, and Tipperary North, at 139.4 (Table 2.27a). Monaghan had the lowest rate of all admissions for depressive disorders in 2014, at 44.6 per 100,000.

Kerry had the highest rate of all admissions for schizophrenia, at 107.9 per 100,000, followed by Donegal, at 96.2, Dublin, at 92.0, and Leitrim, at 91.2 (Table 2.27a). Tipperary South had the lowest rate of all admissions for schizophrenia, at 41.8 per 100,000.

Carlow had the highest rate of all admissions for alcoholic disorders in 2014, at 58.6 per 100,000 population, followed by Donegal, at 53.4, Longford, at 41.0, and Wicklow also at 41.0 (Table 2.27a). Offaly had the lowest rate of all admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 6.5 per 100,000.

As in 2013, admissions from Mayo had the highest rate of first admissions for depressive disorders, at 93.4 per 100,000, followed by Westmeath, at 51.1, Roscommon, at 49.9 and Kerry, at 48.8 (Table 2.27b). Kilkenny had the lowest rate of first admissions for depressive disorders, at 15.7 per 100,000.

Galway had the highest rate of first admissions in 2014 for schizophrenia, at 29.1 per 100,000, followed by Dublin, at 25.7, Kerry, at 23.4, and Cork, at 21.6 (Table 2.27b). Waterford had the lowest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 4.4 per 100,000.

Leitrim had the highest rate of first admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 22.0 per 100,000, followed by Carlow, at 16.5, Wicklow, at 16.1, and Galway, at 15.6 (Table 2.27b). Mayo had the lowest rate of first admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 4.6 per 100,000.



Non-residents

The designation of persons as non-resident is determined by the address given by them on admission and it is therefore likely to represent persons who have recently arrived in the country.

There were 55 admissions for non-residents in 2014, very little change from 2013 (54). Forty per cent of admissions for non-residents in 2014 had an address originating in Northern Ireland, 29% in England, 5.5% in Germany, and 4% each in France, Italy, Netherlands and the USA (Table 2.28). Almost 35% (34.5%) of all admissions for non-residents had a primary admission diagnosis of schizophrenia, 22% had a diagnosis of mania, 16% had a diagnosis of depressive disorders, 9% had a diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, 4% had a diagnosis of other drug disorders and 2% had a diagnosis of eating disorders (Table 2.29).

More than 400 admissions per 100,000 population

3 Hospital Type – Admissions, Discharges and Deaths




Figure 3.1 Hospital type. All admissions. Ireland 2014. Percentages

Fifty-eight percent of all admissions in 2014 were to general hospital psychiatric units, 24% were to independent/private and private charitable centres and 18% were to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (including the Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum; Carraig Mór, Cork; St Joseph’s Intellectual Disability Service, Portrane; and Phoenix Care Centre, Dublin) (Table 3.1 and Figure 3.1). There was a slight increase in the proportion of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, from 55.6% in 2013 to 58% in 2014. The proportion of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres remained unchanged, at 24%, while there was a decrease in the proportion admitted to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, from 20% in 2013 to 18% in 2014. In the ten-year period from 2005–2014 the proportion of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units increased from 49% in 2005 to 58% in 2014; the proportion of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres increased from 19% to 24% and admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units decreased from 32% to 18%.

Re-admissions accounted for 69% of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, 66% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 66% of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres (Table 3.1).

Gender and age

Males accounted for over half of all and first admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units; 52% of all and 58% of first admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and 54% of all and 59% of first admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (Table 3.1). In contrast, 60% of all and 55% of first admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres were for females.

In keeping with the trend of previous years, admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres (some of which provided specialised services for the elderly) had an older age profile than either general hospital psychiatric units or psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units; 61% of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres were aged 45 years and over compared with 42% to general hospital psychiatric units and 47% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (Table 3.2). Over half (58%) of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and over half (53%) of admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units were under 45 years of age compared with 39% to independent/private and private charitable centres. The mean age at admission to independent/private and private charitable centres was 50 (median 51) compared with 45 (median 43) to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units and 43 (median 41) to general hospital psychiatric units.

Marital status

Single persons accounted for 63% of all admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, 57% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units and 40% to independent/private and private charitable centres (Table 3.3). In contrast 45% of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres were married compared with 20% to general hospital psychiatric units and 19% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units.

Socio-economic group

Twenty-eight per cent of all admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres were for higher and lower professionals combined (almost 11% for higher professional and 17% for lower professional) compared with almost 8% (7.5%) to general hospital psychiatric units and 6% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (Table 3.4). Twenty-two per cent of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres had non-manual occupations compared with 12% to general hospital psychiatric units and 8% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units.




Figure 3.2 Hospital type. All admissions by manual and non-manual occupations. Ireland 2014. Percentages

When socio-economic groups were categorised into two distinct groupings – manual and non-manual occupations² – it can be seen that there are clear differentials in admissions to each hospital type. Almost 85% (84.5%) of all admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres had non-manual occupations compared with 52% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units and 51% to general hospital psychiatric units (Figure 3.2).

Primary admission diagnosis

Over one-third of all (35%) and first (32%) admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres had a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders (Table 3.6 and Table 3.7). The comparable figures for general hospital psychiatric units were almost 27% of all and 29% of first, while those for psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units were 19% of all and 23% of first admissions.

Schizophrenia accounted for a much lower proportion of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres, at 6%, than admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, at 23% and psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 27% (Table 3.6). Fourteen per cent of all admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres had a primary admission diagnosis of alcoholic disorders, three times that

of admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 4% and twice that of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, at 6%. Similarly, the proportion of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres with a primary admission diagnosis of neurosis, at 13%, was twice that of admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 6% and almost twice that of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units, at 8%.

Legal status

As in previous years there were considerable differences in the proportion of admissions to hospitals in the public and private sectors. Nineteen per cent of all admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units and 13% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units were involuntary compared with 2% of admissions to independent/private and private charitable centres (Table 3.8). The pattern for involuntary first admissions was similar, with 24% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, almost 15% of admissions to general hospital psychiatric units and just 2% to independent/private and private charitable centres.

Length of stay

One-third of all discharges from both general hospital psychiatric units (35%) and psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (33%) were discharged within one week of admission, compared with 14% of discharges from independent/private and private charitable centres (Table 3.9). Over half of all discharges from general hospital psychiatric units (56%) and from psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (52%) occurred within two weeks of admission, compared with 24% of discharges from independent/private and private charitable centres.

Average length of stay for all discharges was longest for psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 220.6 days (median 12 days), followed by independent/private and private charitable centres, at 48.3 days (median 31 days) and general hospital psychiatric units, at 25.6 days (median 11 days) (Table 3.10a). When discharges of one year or more were excluded, independent/private and private charitable centres had the longest average length of stay, at 34.9 days (median 31 days), followed by psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 27.5 days (median 11 days) and general hospital psychiatric units, at 22.4 days (median 11 days) (Table 3.10b).

4 Individual Units and Hospitals – Admissions, Discharges and Deaths

This chapter presents data on individual units and hospitals, along with data on mental health catchment areas (MHCA). The catchment area breakdowns and the various electoral divisions that comprise each area were previously supplied courtesy of Health Atlas, Health Intelligence Unit in the HSE, and these areas were updated using the CSO census of population for 2011. The populations for most areas were confirmed with Local Health Offices (LHO), but the verification of the composition of some catchment areas still remains outstanding due to uncertainty regarding boundaries. Notwithstanding this, the numbers concerned are small and are not likely to change the rates significantly. A list of the individual units and hospitals by each catchment area and CHO is presented in Appendix 4.

One new approved centre opened in 2014, the Ashlin Centre, Beaumont Hospital, Dublin. There are two units in the Ashlin Centre, Joyce Unit and Sheehan Unit and data for these two units are presented separately. Three approved centres closed during 2014, St Ita's Hospital, Portrane, Hawthorn Unit, Connolly Hospital, Dublin and Joyce Rooms, Fairview Community Unit, Dublin. The addition of new centres and the closure of existing centres will affect trends in the rates for catchment areas over time and this should be borne in mind if comparing rates for such catchment areas over a particular time period.

In 2014 as in 2013, six beds in the Department of Psychiatry, Midland Regional Hospital, Portlaoise, were allocated to patients from Lakeview Unit, Naas General Hospital. As this report is activity-based, admissions for these patients from Lakeview Unit are included in figures for the Midland Regional Hospital, Portlaoise. As noted earlier also, the acute unit in St Brigid's Hospital, Ballinasloe closed at the end of March 2014 and all acute admissions are directed to University College Hospital Galway and this will affect numbers and rates for both areas. Changes or items of note regarding individual units and hospitals are indicated with footnotes in Table 4.2. All tables referred to in this chapter are presented at the end of the chapter.

All and first admissions for individual catchment areas and their respective populations are presented in Table 4.1. All admission rates ranged from 565.8 per 100,000 in West Galway to 24.8 in East Galway. Rates for first admissions ranged from 153.5 per 100,000 in Dublin North Central to 10.9 in Dun Laoghaire.



Admissions to individual units and hospitals for 2013 and 2014, along with the difference and percentage change from 2013–2014 are presented in Table 4.2. Admissions to general hospital psychiatric units increased by 92, from 10,278 in 2013 to 10,370 in 2014, while admissions to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units fell by 549, from 3,768 in 2013 to 3,219 in 2014 and admissions to private hospitals also fell, from 4,411 in 2013 to 4,208 in 2014, down by 203 admissions.

Primary admission diagnosis by catchment area

Table 4.3 and Table 4.4 present all and first admission rates for each catchment area by primary admission diagnosis. All admission rates for depressive disorders were highest in Mayo, at 226.6 per 100,000, followed by Roscommon, at 151.6, North Lee, at 145.2 and West Galway, at 112.5 (Table 4.3). East Galway had the lowest rate, at 8.3 per 100,000.

West Galway had the highest rate of all admissions for schizophrenia, at 144.2 per 100,000, followed by Dublin North Central, at 129.2, Dublin South East, at 106.6 and Kerry, at 105.8 (Table 4.3). East Galway had the lowest rate, at 6.6 per 100,000.

Donegal had the highest rate of all admissions for alcoholic disorders, as in 2013, at 53.3 per 100,000, followed by North Lee, at 39.1, Dublin North Central, at 39.0 and West Galway, at 38.5 (Table 4.3). Laois/Offaly had the lowest rate of all admissions for alcoholic disorders, at 0.6 per 100,000.

First admissions for depressive disorders were highest in Mayo, at 89.6 per 100,000, followed by North Lee, at 62.2, Roscommon, at 59.4 and West Galway, at 59.4 (Table 4.4). Rates were lowest in Dun Laoghaire, at 2.2 per 100,000.

West Galway had the highest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 46.3 per 100,000, followed by Dublin South City, at 41.8, followed by Dublin North Central, at 35.8 and Dublin South East, at 35.5 (Table 4.4). East Galway had the lowest rate of first admissions for schizophrenia, at 1.7 per 100,000.

First admissions for alcoholic disorders were highest in West Galway, at 17.7 per 100,000, followed by Donegal at 16.5, North Lee, at 14.3 and West Cork, at 12.4 (Table 4.4). Dun Laoghaire had the lowest rate, at 0.5 per 100,000 (Dublin North had no admissions for alcoholic disorders).



Length of stay

As in previous years there were wide variations in the length of stay on discharge across all hospitals. In some hospitals over 40% of discharges occurred within one week of admission; Tallaght Hospital (45%); Our Lady's Hospital, Navan (44%); St Luke's Hospital, Kilkenny (41%); University College Hospital Galway (44%); St Vincent's Hospital, Fairview (48%); Joyce Rooms, Fairview Community Unit (now closed) (41%); Newcastle Hospital, Greystones (41%); St Brigid's Hospital, Ardee (47%); Ballytivnan Sligo/Leitrim Mental Health Services (42%) (Table 4.20 and Table 4.21). In contrast, the proportion of discharges within one week of admission in independent/private and private charitable centres was less than 20%; St Patrick's Hospital, 16%; St Edmundsbury, 14%; St John of God Hospital, 13%; Highfield Hospital, 9%, Lois Bridges, 3%. Bloomfield had no discharges within one week of admission (Table 4.22).

The average length of stay for all discharges for individual units and hospitals is presented in Table 4.23, Table 4.24 and Table 4.25. Sheehan Unit in the Ashlin Centre, Beaumont Hospital, had the longest average length of stay, at 126.3 days (median 177) (Table 4.23), however there were only three discharges from Sheehan Unit and two of these patients may have been originally admitted to Hawthorn Unit in Connolly Hospital before it closed. Mercy Hospital, Cork had the second-longest average length of stay, at 36.2 days (median 13 days), followed by St James' Hospital, at 32.2 days (median 11 days) and Midland Regional Hospital, Portlaoise, at 31.9 days (median 12 days).

Average length of stay for psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units is typically longer than in general hospital units and this can be seen from Table 4.24 where length of stay for many centres is in excess of 1,000 days. Caution should be exercised when interpreting data for some hospitals where particularly long lengths of stay are observed for very few discharges thus skewing the average length of stay. The average length of stay for independent/private and private charitable centres was longest for Bloomfield Hospital, at 2,795.1 days (median 2,357.5) which had just ten discharges (Table 4.25). In contrast, length of stay was shortest in St Patrick's Hospital, at 33.7 days (median 30) for 2,461 discharges.

5 Child and Adolescent Admissions

This chapter presents data on admissions for persons under 18 years of age to adult and specialised child and adolescent services, regardless of the in-patient facility to which they were admitted. Thus, some admissions may have been reported on earlier in the report. However, data on admissions to specialised child and adolescent units have not been reported on previously in this report. These centres are Linn Dara Child and Adolescent unit, Dublin; Ginesa Unit, St John of God Hospital, Dublin; CAMHS Galway; St Joseph's Adolescent In-patient Unit, St Vincent's Hospital, Fairview; Éist Linn Child and Adolescent In-patient Unit, Cork; and Willow Grove Adolescent Unit, St Patrick's Hospital, Dublin.

All and first admissions

There were 436 admissions for under 18s to all hospital types in 2014 (Table 5.1). This is a small increase (21) in admissions from 2013 (415). Seventy-six per cent of all admissions for under 18s were first admissions. There were 343 admissions to specialised child and adolescent in-patient units and 74% of these were first admissions (Table 5.2). There were 93 admissions for under 18s to adult units and hospitals.

Gender and age

Almost 67% (66.5%) of all and 65% of first admissions for under 18s were female (Table 5.1). Over one-third (36%) of all admissions were aged 17 years of age on admission, 27% were aged 16 years, 19% were aged 15 years, 12% were aged 14 years, 4% were aged 13 years and 1% were aged 12 years or younger (Table 5.1).

Almost 69% (68.5%) of all and 67% of first admissions to specialised child and adolescent in-patient units were female (Table 5.2). Thirty-one per cent of all admissions to specialised child and adolescent in-patient units were 17 years of age on admission, 26% were aged 16 years, 22% were aged 15 years, almost 15% were aged 14 years, 5% were aged 13 years and 2% were aged 12 years or younger (Table 5.2).

Of the 93 admissions to adult psychiatric units and hospitals, 53 were aged 17 years, 28 were aged 16 years, 8 were aged 15 years, 2 were aged 14 years and a further 2 were aged 13 years or younger.



Primary admission diagnosis

Over one-third (34%) of all admissions for under 18s in 2014 had a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders, almost 14% had a diagnosis of eating disorders and 12% had a diagnosis of neuroses (Table 5.3). Females accounted for 68% of all admissions with a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders, 93% of admissions with eating disorders and almost 62% of admissions with neuroses. Males accounted for 78% of admissions with a primary admission diagnosis of other drug disorders and 47% of those with schizophrenia.

Similar proportions were observed for first admissions; 36% of first admissions had a diagnosis of depressive disorders, 14% had a diagnosis of eating disorders and 12% had a diagnosis of neuroses (Table 5.3). Females accounted for 65% of first admissions with a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders, almost 68% of first admissions with neuroses, 59% of first admissions with mania and 91% of first admissions with eating disorders. Males accounted for 52% of first admissions with a primary admission diagnosis of schizophrenia and 82% of first admissions with a diagnosis of other drug disorders.

Legal status

Four per cent of all (16 admissions) and 3% of first admissions (9 admissions) for under 18s in 2014 were involuntary (Table 5.4). Almost 38% of all involuntary admissions for under 18s had a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders, 25% had a diagnosis of other drug disorders and 19% had eating disorders (Table 5.5). Thirty-three per cent of involuntary first admissions had a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders and 22% had a diagnosis of eating disorders (Table 5.5).

Hospital type

Seventy-nine per cent of all admissions for under 18s were to specialised child and adolescent in-patient units, 19% were to general hospital psychiatric units and almost 3% were to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units. Similar proportions were observed for first admissions with 77% of first admissions for under 18s to specialised child and adolescent in-patient units, 20% to general hospital psychiatric units and 3% to psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (Table 5.6).

Length of stay

Almost 84% of under 18s admitted in 2014 were also discharged in 2014. Of those admitted and discharged in 2014, 18% were discharged within one week of admission, 10% were discharged within one to two weeks, 11% were discharged within two to four weeks, 45% were discharged within one to three months and 16% were discharged within three months to one year (Table 5.7).

The average length of stay for all under 18s admitted and discharged in 2014 was 48.8 days (median 37 days) (Table 5.8). Average length of stay was longest in child and adolescent units, at 61.0 days (median 49.5), followed by psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units, at 41.9 days (median 6 days) and by general hospital psychiatric units, at 8.7 days (median 5 days) (Table 5.8).

6 In-patient Census 2014




Figure 6.1 Irish Psychiatric Units and Hospitals Census 1963-2014. Numbers

An in-patient census was taken on 31 December 2014 and all patients resident in approved centres were counted. There were 2,228 patients resident on 31 December 2014, a rate of 48.6 per 100,000 total population (Table 6.1 and Table 6.2). This is a decline in patients resident since 31 March 2013 by 173 and an 89% reduction in in-patient numbers since 1963, when there were 19,801 patients resident in psychiatric units and hospitals (Table 6.1 and Figure 6.1). There were an additional 71 under 18s resident in specialist child and adolescent units on 31 December 2014. These are discussed below under child and adolescent residents and are not included in the main census analysis.

Gender and age

Fifty-five per cent (1,216) of patients resident on 31 December 2014 were male, 45% were female (1,012). Thirty-five per cent (777) were aged 65 years and over, 33% (735) were aged 45-64 years, 26% (581) were aged 25-44 years and 6% (135) were aged 24 years or younger (Table 6.2). There was only one patient aged under 18 years of age on 31 December 2014 resident in adult psychiatric units and hospitals. Sixty per cent of all patients resident were single, 19% were married, 6% widowed and 2% divorced (Table 6.3).

Primary admission diagnosis

Thirty-one per cent (689) had a diagnosis of schizophrenia, 16% (354) depressive disorders and 12% (264) organic mental disorders (Table 6.4). In-patients with a primary admission diagnosis of schizophrenia had the highest rate of hospitalisation, at 15.0 per 100,000 population, followed by depressive disorders, at 7.7 and organic mental disorders, at 5.8 (Table 6.4).

Males had a higher rate of hospitalisation for schizophrenia than females, at 19.5 per 100,000, compared with 10.6 for females (Table 6.4). Females had a higher rate for depressive disorders than males, at 9.1 per 100,000 for females and 6.3 for males.

Length of stay

Thirty-eight per cent (844) of residents were long-stay patients on census night, i.e. had been in hospital for one year or more; 16% (362) were new long-stay, i.e. in hospital for between one and five years and 22% (482) were old long-stay, i.e. in hospital for five years or more (Table 6.5).

The total number of in-patient days for all patients on census night was 3,755,844; schizophrenia (689 patients) accounted for 42% of this total and intellectual disability (136 patients) accounted for 34%. The average length of stay for all patients was 1,685.8 (median 101 days) (Table 6.6). When patients with a length of stay of one year or more were excluded the average length of stay was 62.31 days (median 28 days) with the total number of in-patient days at 86,231. Schizophrenia (334 patients) accounted for 35% of this total, organic mental disorders (107 patients) accounted for 15% and depressive disorders (298 patients) 14% (Table 6.7).

Hospital type

Thirty-four per cent of patients resident on 31 December 2014 were in general hospital psychiatric units (up from 30% in 2013), 33% were in psychiatric hospitals/continuing care units (down from 35% in 2013) and 22% were in independent/private and private charitable centres (down from 24% in 2013) (Table 6.8). Four per cent were in the Central Mental Hospital, Dundrum (unchanged from 2013), 5% were in St Joseph's Intellectual Disability Service (unchanged from 2013) and less than one per cent (0.94%) were in Carraig Mór, Cork (down slightly from 1.5% in 2013).



Child and adolescent residents

There were 72 under 18s resident on census night; 71 of these were resident in child and adolescent units and one was resident in a general hospital psychiatric unit (Table 6.9). Twenty-nine per cent were male and 71% were female. Thirty-six per cent were aged 17 years on census night, 19% were aged 16 years, 21% were aged 15 years, 11% were 14 years and 12.5% were aged 13 years or younger.

Twenty-nine per cent of under 18s had a primary admission diagnosis of depressive disorders, 24% had a diagnosis of eating disorders, 10% had a diagnosis of neuroses, 8% had a diagnosis of schizophrenia with a further 8% having a diagnosis of mania (Table 6.10).

Four per cent had been in hospital for under one week on census night, 7% had been hospitalised for between one and two weeks, 24% were in hospital for between two and four weeks, 47% had been in hospital for between one and three months and 18% were in hospital for between three months and one year (Table 6.11). Average length of stay was longest for under 18s with a primary admission diagnosis of schizophrenia, at 109.5 days (median 61.5), followed by other drug disorders, at 91.0 days (median 91) and neuroses, at 68.4 days (median 22) (Table 6.12). The shortest average length of stay was for residents with a primary admission diagnosis of mania, at 37.6 days (median 34 days).
