q1 Do you think that, in your local area, people using or dealing drugs are a very serious problem, somewhat serious, not too serious, or not a problem at all? (%)

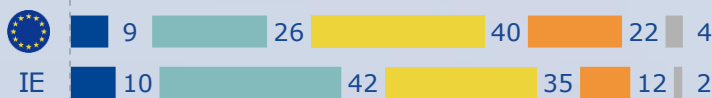

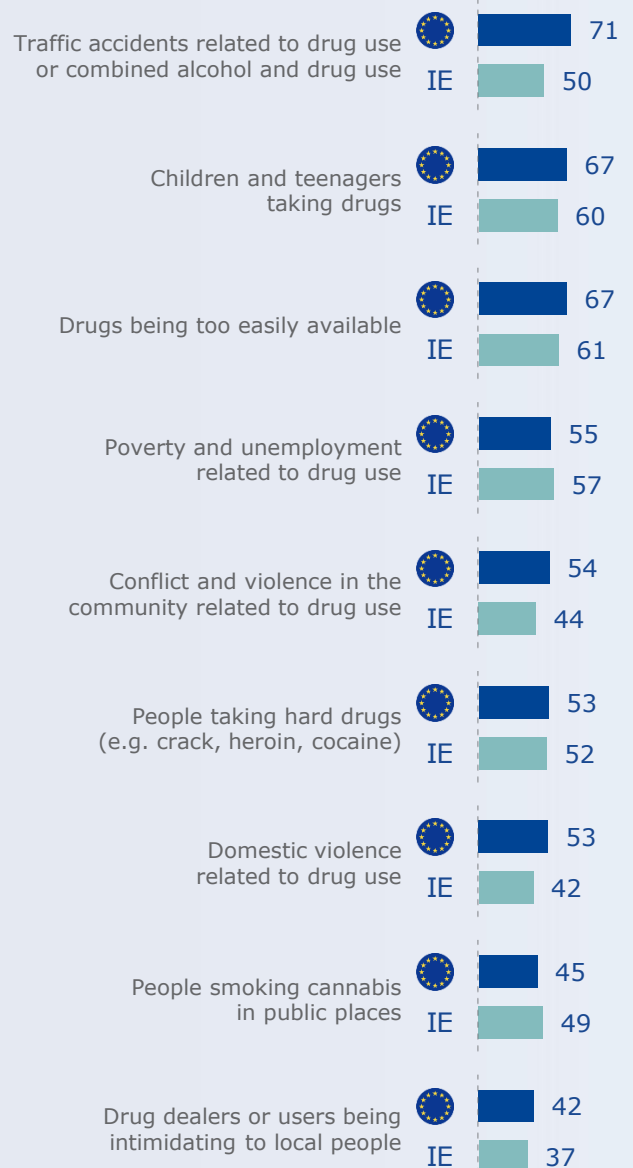
The availability and use of drugs is central to reducing the overall quality of life in my local area

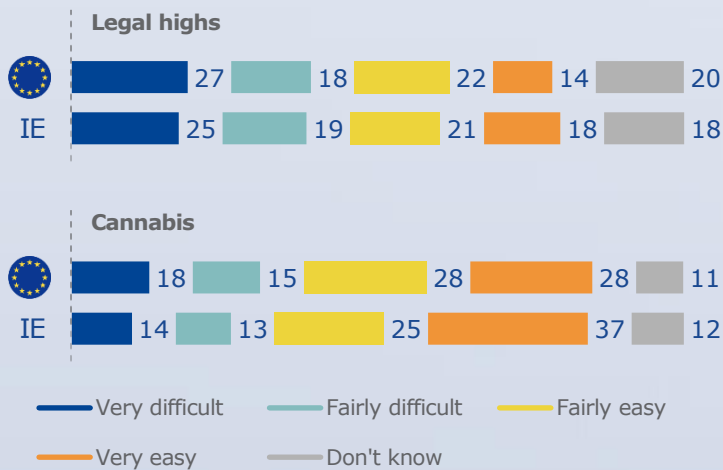
q2 Which of the following would you say are a problem in your local area associated with people using or dealing drugs? (% "Yes")

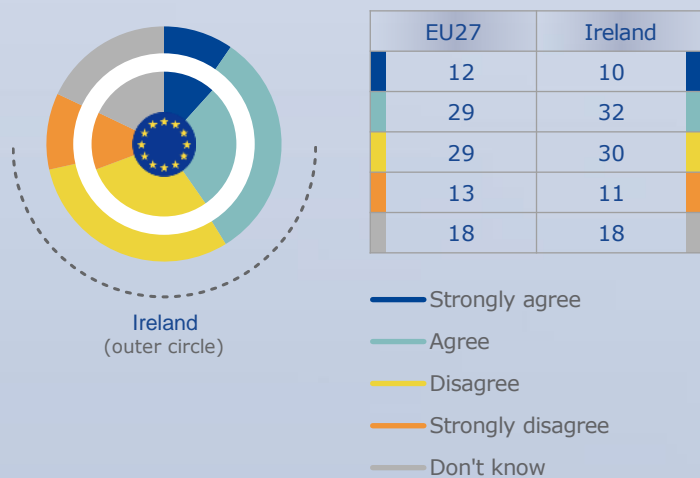


Access to illicit drugs

q11 How difficult or easy do you think it would be for you personally to obtain the following substances within 24 hours if you wanted some? (%)

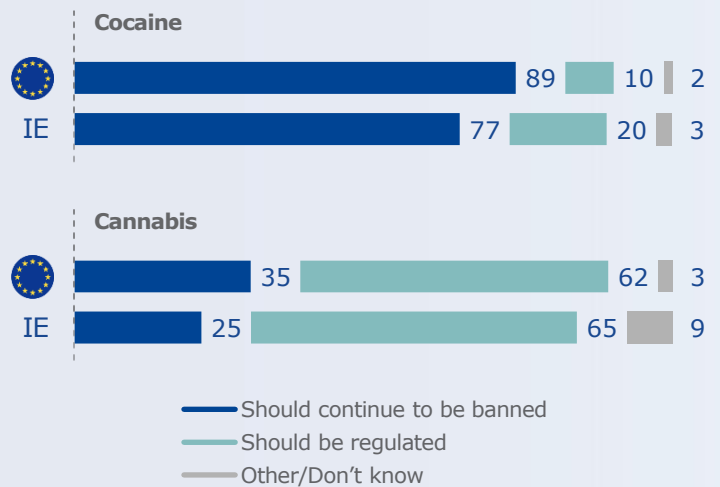


q7 These days drugs are sometimes sold online and shipped via postal services. Do you think that online sales of drugs are increasing drug problems in your local area? (%)
