


2020 – 2022: Number of awards



making best use of existing health and social care data sources, to deliver high quality, high impact evidence for policy and/or practice




Example: Prescription drugs with potential for misuse: A multi-indicator analysis of supply, patterns of use and the associated health burden in Ireland over the past ten years



Applied Partnership Awards

addressing priorities of the Irish HSC system by engaging 'knowledge users' in the research process from idea formulation to dissemination and implementation



Example: *I-PARC (Ireland's Physical Activity Research Collaboration): Bridging the research to action gap to support the implementation of the National Physical Activity Plan*
